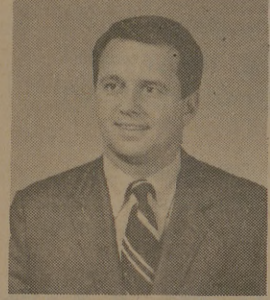

Big win over Cal puts Horns near top of poll

By The Associated Press The Texas Longhorns took a giant step toward regaining their No. 1 national ranking Saturday with a 56-15 rout of California.

They drew 16 first-place votes in this week's Associated Press poll to 14 for top-rated Ohio State Monday, but trailed the Buckeyes in total points 645-632. Last week, Ohio State led by 71 points.

The names of the Top Ten teams are the same as last week, although there were several position changes. Stanford defeated San Jose State 34-3 and climbed from fourth to third, replacing Southern California, which battled to a 21-all tie with Nebraska and dropped to seventh.

Penn State's 55-7 walloping of Navy pushed the Nittany Lions from seventh to fourth. Missis-

sippi and Notre Dame remained fifth and sixth, the Rebels trouncing Memphis State 47-13 and the Irish beating Northwestern 35-14.

Following seventh-place Southern Cal came Nebraska, up from ninth; Missouri, up from 10th, and Michigan, down from eighth. Missouri crushed Minnesota 34-12 while Michigan had problems in beating Arizona 20-9.

The other seven first-place votes from the sports writers and broadcasters went to Penn State and Southern Cal, two each, and one apiece to Stanford, Mississippi and Michigan.

Houston, which routed Syracuse 42-15, leaped from 15th to 11th and headed the Second Ten. Then came Arkansas, down one; Florida, up one; Oklahoma, up four; UCLA and West Virginia, both up one, and four new teams in the 17-18-19-20 spots—Tennessee, Colorado, Georgia Tech and Air Force.

Losing their ranking status were Louisiana State, upset by

Texas A&M 20-18; Kansas State, a 16-3 loser to Kentucky; Georgia, which bowed to Tulane 17-14, and Arizona State, despite a 38-9 victory over Colorado State.

Browns use quick scores to top Jets

CLEVELAND (AP)—A spectacular 94-yard touchdown runback of the second half kickoff by Homer Jones and a 65-yard punt in the final two minutes led Cleveland to a 31-21 victory over the New York Jets in the Browns' American Football Conference debut Monday night.

A record Cleveland crowd of 85,703 and a national television audience watched the Browns take an early lead and hold it.

Substitute linebacker Billy Andrews iced the victory when with 35 seconds left he intercepted a Joe Namath pass at the New York 25, fell down, got up and scampered in for a touchdown.

Jones' touchdown gave the Browns a 21-7 lead. Then, with the Browns leading 24-14 in the fourth quarter, Jack Gregory

pounced on a fumble by the Jets' Matt Snell on the Cleveland seven-yard line.

The Browns used up almost six minutes after that before giving up the ball when Don Cockeroff missed an 18-yard field goal.

Namath then passed the Jets back into contention with 3:22 left when he completed an 80-yard, four-play drive with a 33-yard touchdown pass to George Sauer.

The Browns failed to move, but Cockeroff uncorked a 65-yard punt that drove the Jets back to the four-yard-line.

New York's Ed Bell called for a fair catch at the 30 but the ball bounced past him and he was nailed at the four.

Andrews' clinching touchdown came four plays later.

Rookie no-hits Twins

OAKLAND (AP) — Oakland rookie Vida Blue, a fastballing 21-year-old left-hander, tossed a no-hitter at the Minnesota Twins Monday night as the A's trimmed the American League West leaders 6-0.

The Twins, who needed a victory to clinch the West title, were stopped by the six-footer from Mansfield, La., whose best pitch was a fastball mixed with a sharp breaking curve.

With a crowd of 4,284 roaring its approval, Blue calmly went out in the ninth and struck out leadoff batter Danny Thompson on four pitches. Pinch-hitter Bob Allison struck out swinging on a 2-2 pitch and Cesar Tovar fouled out to Mincher.

Blue, 2-0, recalled from the minors 18 days ago, twirled a one-hitter only 10 days ago in beating Kansas City in his second start.

Monday night, the lefty with a blazing fast ball, missed a per-

fect game when he allowed the Twins' their only runner — a fourth inning two-out walk to Harmon Killebrew. He struck out nine.

The Twins rapped only three balls to the outfield and the closest Minnesota came to a base hit was in the fifth when George Mitterwald lined to shortstop Leo Cardenas, who made a leaping, backhanded catch.

The A's jumped on Jim Perry, 23-12, for a first inning run on Bert Campaneris' triple, who scored on a double play bouncer, and wrapped it up in the eighth keyed by Campaneris' three-run homer as the A's scored five runs.

Oakland's Jim Hunter had

tossed the A's last no-hitter, a perfect game against these same Twins, two years ago.

Other no-hit games this season were thrown by Clyde Wright of the California Angels, Bill Singer of the Los Angeles Dodgers and Dock Ellis of the Pittsburgh Pirates.

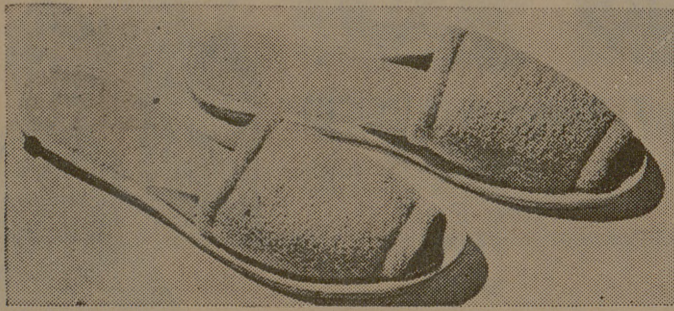

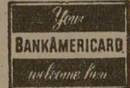

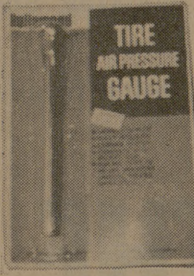
