## Browns use quick scores to top Jets

CLEVELAND (AP)-A spectacular 94-yard touchdown runback of the second half kickoff by Homer Jones and a 65-yard punt in the final two minutes led Cleveland to a 31-21 victory over the New York Jets in the Browns' American Football Conference debut Monday night.

A record Cleveland crowd of 85,703 and a national television audience watched the Browns take an early lead and hold it.

Substitute linebacker Billy Andrews iced the victory when with 35 seconds left he intercepted a Joe Namath pass at the New York 25, fell down, got up and scampered in for a touchdown.

Jones' touchdown gave the Browns a 21-7 lead. Then, with the Browns leading 24-14 in the fourth quarter, Jack Gregory

pounced on a fumble by the Jets' Matt Snell on the Cleveland seven-yard line.
