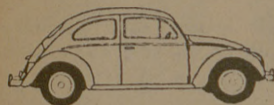

# A&M receives \$2 million

Texas A&M has been awarded National Science Foundation grants totaling \$2.5 million for operation of the institution's Sea Grant Program, announced Acting President A. R. Lueddecke.

The grants include \$1,166,000 for academic year 1970-71 and \$1,400,000 in 1971-72 for development of marine resources in Texas.

In addition to the work conducted by A&M, the funds also will help support marine work at six other Texas schools and at Dow Chemical Co., Lueddecke said.

"We are expanding our cooperative efforts with other Texas schools and with industry in order to focus the best talents in the state toward the area of marine resources and to fulfill the needs of the state for education, research and advisory services," explained Dr. John C. Calhoun, A&M's vice president for programs and director of its Sea Grant Program.

During 1970-71, third year of

the program, A&M will direct \$166,900 toward cooperative work with Del Mar College in Corpus Christi, Texas State Technical Institute at Waco and Harlingen, University of Houston, Lamar State College of Technology at Beaumont, and Brazosport Junior College and Dow Chemical at Freeport.

Calhoun said the program at A&M is a university-wide effort, with participation by 21 departments and divisions in eight of the university's colleges.

Under its Sea Grant Program agreement with NSF, A&M provides matching funds which raise

the total third-year effort to more than \$1.7 million and next year's program to \$2.1 million, the university official explained.

Calhoun said Sea Grant funds will be used to support 50 projects involving more than 100 professional staff members.

This year's program includes \$611,000 for research, \$254,500 for education and training programs, \$150,000 for marine advisory services and \$150,500 for program direction and development.

Research activities involve investigations in living resources (primarily fisheries), seafood science and technology, manage-

ment and preservation of the environment, mineral resources, engineering and technology, marine socio-economics and marine resources law.

Technical development services will also be initiated under the third-year grant through A&M's Industrial Economics Research Division. This project will provide technical assistance to port directors and developers, small manufacturing firms and the marine recreation industry.

The Sea Grant Program is directed toward development of educational, research and advisory activities in the fields of marine science and education. A&M is one of 10 universities in the nation receiving institutional support under the NSF program.

Alan Giles, senior in political science, asked why a course proposed in black politics last year had been turned down.

"The executive committee was more in favor of an ethnic approach," McCandless explained. "The head of the political science department then (Dr. William C. Gibbons) said it's either this (the black politics course) or nothing at all."

"Sociology now has a course in ethnic sociology," Giles said. "If sociology students wanted a more specific course, say one studying the ghetto Negro, do you think this would have a chance?"

McCandless said if the course proposal was well developed, he felt it would go through.
