Jimmy Sheffield takes SWC punting lead

Although Jimmy Sheffield did not kick but twice last Saturday against Ohio State, the Aggie punter got enough foot into the ball to take over the Southwest this season when he ran one back Conference punting lead with a 41.4 average on eight kicks.

Sheffield booted for 41 and 52 yards against the Buckeyes for a 46.5 average to pass Southern Methodist University's sophomore punter, Sam McClarty. McClarty has a 41.1 average on 17 kicks.

The Aggies also held the lead in three other categories after statistics were released by the SWC office this week.
