they have for Texas A&M. "There is more genuine love for this institution here than at any other place I've been," he

added. Texas A&M's new president has a busy schedule for much of the month. Wednesday he will meet with officials at Tarleton State College; Thursday, he will meet with a state Senate subcommittee on agriculture to explain A&M's program plans; Friday he will be in Austin to meet with Gov. Preston Smith, Lt. Gov. Ben Barnes and other state officials.

Saturday he plans to attend the A&M-SMU game in Dallas. Sunday through Tuesday he will be in Washington, D.C., attending a national meeting of the land grant and state universities organization. Later this month, he will visit A&M Clubs in Amarillo, Dallas, San Antonio and Houston.

Williams has known about A&M for years, both because of its national reputation and because of his term as Coordinating Board commissioner.

"I like the programs, I like the role A&M has announced and has followed," he said. "A&M is, in my opinion, just simply a cut above the other land grant schools."

The new president also said:

-"I think ROTC is one of the fundamental, basic programs at Texas A&M, and under no conditions will I entertain any argument with people who would want to close it out."

-"I think reasonable and rational student assistance in university affairs is called for. Student membership on university committees should be an automatic thing."
