

# Irish surge in poll

Texas remained on top for a second week but Notre Dame surged ahead from third to second while Ohio State dropped another notch from second to third in The Associated Press major college football poll Monday.

Texas, which supplanted Ohio State as No. 1 a week ago, received 20 first-place votes and 701 points from a panel of 40 sports writers and broadcasters after trouncing Southern Methodist 42-15 for a 6-0 record.

Notre Dame, which began the season in sixth place but has moved up steadily, also won its sixth in a row, blasting Navy 56-7. The Fighting Irish picked up 12 first-place votes and 684 points, third closest 1-2 balloting of the season.

Last week, Texas led Ohio State by only six points, but the Buckeyes slipped to five first-place votes and 617 points after a come-from-behind 24-10 victory over Northwestern. Ohio State also is unbeaten in six starts.

Nebraska, Michigan and Stanford held onto the 4-5-6 spots with Michigan getting two first-place votes and Stanford one. Nebraska whipped Colorado 29-16, Michigan downed Wisconsin 29-15 and Stanford crushed Oregon State 48-10.

Arkansas and Tennessee each moved up one place to seventh and eighth, respectively. The Razorbacks shellacked Texas A&M 45-6 and the Vols hammered Wake Forest 41-7.

Air Force, which needed a last-second field goal to edge Arizona 23-20 and maintain its undefeated status, skidded from seventh to ninth and Auburn made it back into the Top Ten, up from 12th,

with a 63-14 mauling of Florida. The Tigers replaced Louisiana State, which was idle.

## Philley, Lord have surgery

A&M offensive tackle Andy Philley and linebacker Mike Lord were reported doing okay Monday after undergoing surgery Sunday to repair torn knee ligaments suffered in the Aggies' 45-6 loss to Arkansas Saturday.

Both are juniors and will be sidelined for the remainder of the season.

Trainer Billy Pickard said the injuries were practically identical and said this was very unusual. Only once previously had the type of injury been suffered by an A&M football player in his six years as trainer.

"I was hit while back padding blocking. I was set and blocking on one man and was hit by someone else," Philley said regarding his injury.

## Ybarbo seventh at NCAA meet

Frank Ybarbo and Ruben Moncivaiz of the A&M cross country team placed seventh and tenth respectively Friday at the NCAA District Six Championships at Houston.

Ybarbo, who had placed first in all three meets he had run in this season, and Moncivaiz had placed second, third and seventh in his three meets.

The University of Texas at Austin and Southern Methodist University both took full teams of seven to the meet and placed second and fourth in the team division. Houston won the team division.

SMU is the defending SWC champion and Texas is runnerup. Ybarbo and Moncivaiz placed in front of all Texas and SMU runners.

The Aggies will travel to Austin this afternoon for their first meet of the year, a triangular affair with the Aggies, Texas and Baylor.

Ybarbo, Moncivaiz, Sammy Skinner, Bill Johnson, Jim Haynie, Pat Bradley and Dennis O'Brien will run for A&M in the three mile race.

In Friday's six mile event, Coach Ted Nelson said that both Ybarbo and Moncivaiz ran the best they have this year.

Ybarbo crossed the three mile point in 14:37 and Moncivaiz 15:03, the fastest either has run this season. Ybarbo ran his opening mile in 4:22.

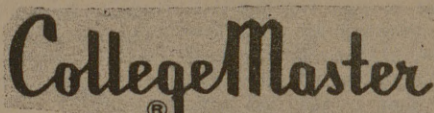

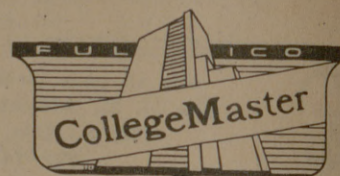
