

Sponsored by the federal Agency for International Development (AID), the program aim is to upgrade Argentina's agricultural economics through graduate training at A&M and research in Argentina. The program began Feb. 1, 1964, and ends Dec. 31

"The major overall objective was to establish an active and effective agricultural economics service and contribute to the establishment of the agricultural economics discipline in Argentina," said Dr. Jack D. Gray, International Programs director.
