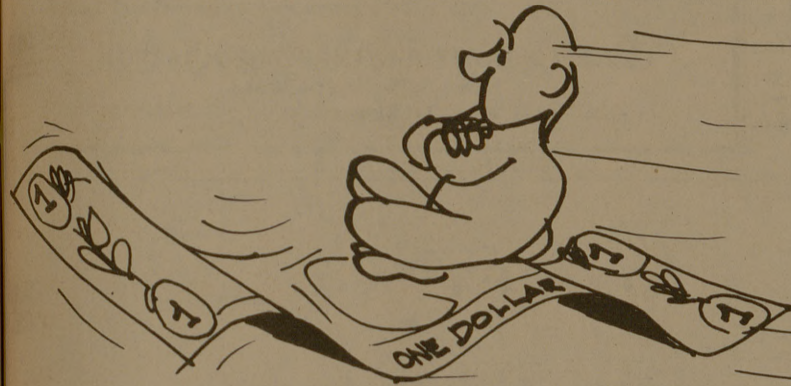

Indulgence asked during construction

Continued indulgence by students, faculty, staff and visitors has been requested by officials responsible for Texas A&M's construction program.

Several areas of the campus are affected by construction of the new Engineering Building, Oceanography-Meteorology Building, 1,000-student residence hall, installation of new utility pipes and work in the Memorial Student Center-Guion Hall area.

"We sincerely appreciate the patience and tolerance of everyone for any inconveniences caused by increased construction activities," said J. O. Adams, the university's facilities planning and construction director.

"While we all may incur an occasional inconvenience as a result of one or more of these construction projects," Adams said, "they are necessary for a growing institution dedicated to providing top facilities for its students and faculty."

He predicted even more bottlenecks before improvements become apparent.

"We have a very cooperative group of contractors who are anxious to complete their assignments as we are to get our campus back to normal," Adams said, "but there is still much work to be done."

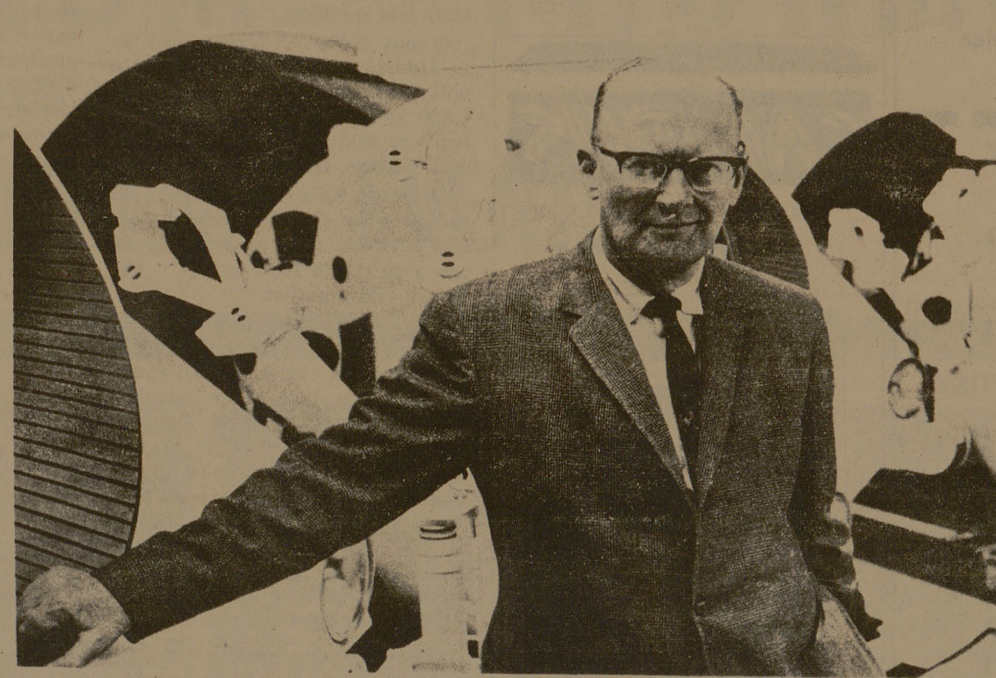
