Area group designates Ivey outstanding engineer for '70

Dr. Don L. Ivey Thursday was named Outstanding Young Engineer for 1970 by the Brazos chapter of the Texas Society for Professional Engineers.

Ivey heads technical support services of the Texas Transportation Institute Highway Safety Research Center at the Texas A&M Research Annex.

The associate professor of civil engineering at Texas A&M also is engineer in charge of TTI's crash dynamics research for the highway safety research program.

Ivey is author or co-author of several technical papers concerning application of structural engineering to vehicle crash dynamics, is active in numerous professional societies and community and social life.

The six-year A&M faculty member also is involved in development and techniques for providing low cost housing for the disadvantaged. Ivey designed a low cost housing unit now being considered for production.

He is a member of the Bryan-College Station Chamber of Commerce, president of the Hender-

son Elementary School Parent-Teachers Association and active in Boy Scouting, local school systems and formation of an airport authority and planning and zoning.

He joined the A&M faculty in 1964 after completing the bachelor degree at Lamar Tech and the master's and Ph.D. degrees here.
