A reading of the Texas Clean Air Act of 1969 reveals the following warning: "Except as authorized by a rule, regulation or variance of other order of the board no person may cause, suffer, allow or permit the emission of an air contaminant or the performance of any activity which causes or contributes to, or which will cause or contribute to, a condition of air pollution" (Section 4.01). To our knowledge A&M has received no such variance.

Section 1.03 of the same act defines air pollution as "The presence in the atmosphere of one or more contaminants, or combinations thereof, in such concentra-
