



Master plan made by Architecture for Port Aransas Several students in the College

of Architecture and Environmental Design have prepared a master plan for the City of Port Aransas, which is rebuilding in the wake of last summer's Hurricane Celia.

Public presentation of the students' plans was completed this week at the Port Aransas Town Hall.

The project was undertaken by a section of students in the College of Architecture and Environmental Design's fourth-year design class.

Assistant Professor Anthony Caporina coordinated activities. Funds for the study were provided by the George Hawn Foun-

dation and the college. The students became interested in preparing the master plan af-

ter conversations with Corpus

Christi architects. Initial planning by the students was well received by Port Aransas officials and the Coastal Bend Regional Planning Commission.

"Although manipulating the physical environment, emphasis centered on human development." Caporina explained, "and recreation provided the means for achieving these goals."

He said one of the more challenging facets of the project was the "sensitive use of the area's delicate ecosystem to provide the resources needed for recreation."

"As it turned out," the professor concluded, "nature also provided the only protection from hurricanes with its tall sand dunes which run along the gulf."


