X-rays biggest peace threat, specialist says

DAVIDSON, N.S. (AP) - The most serious peacetime radiation threat to Americans is not nuclear power plants but ordinary medical and dental X-rays, radiation specialist Dr. Karl Z. Morgan said Tuesday.

Medical X-rays are responsible for 3,300 deaths per year in the United States and may lead to as many as 46,000 deaths in future generations because of genetic damage, he said in an address at Davidson College.

Morgan, director of the Health Physics Division of Oak Ridge National Laboratory in Tennessee, said in contrast, that statistics indicate nuclear industries are responsible for only 18 deaths per year and may lead to 140 deaths in subsequent generations.

Morgan, editor of the Journal of Health Physics and a member of the national and international committees on radiation protection, said all evidence indicates the more dosage a person receives, the more the damage done to his body and genes.

"There can be no threshold dose so low that the probability of serious damage is zero," he said. No dosage of X-rays or any kind of radiation is com-


