Apollo 14 has battery problem

SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP) — A battery problem developed in the Apollo 14 lunar landing vehicle today just hours before the astronauts were to orbit the moon.

There was no immediate indication of the severity of the problem or whether it could block an attempt at a moon landing Friday.

No official announcement was made, but sources reported the difficulty was with one of two batteries in the ascent stage of

the lunar module the astronauts call Antares.

The word came as astronauts Alan B. Shepard Jr., Edgar D. Mitchell and Stuart A. Roosa started a nine-hour sleep period, resting for the grueling days ahead in the vicinity of the moon.

The sources said that during the lunar module check Shepard and Mitchell had tested the batteries and that ground indications showed one registering 37.1 volts and the other 37. They are supposed to have the same reading.

Senate size increase fails; Ceaser Chavez commended

AUSTIN (AP) — House members again fell short today of approving a proposed constitutional change increasing the Senate from 31 to 39 members.
The vote was 94-52, compared with Monday's 78-67 vote. The

measure needs a two-thirds vote — 100 votes — to clear the House and go to the Senate.
"This is a very bad bill, a self-seeking bill," said Rep. Dick Reed of Dallas, who fought it Monday.
"This achieves one thing, it

keeps senators closer to the voting public so they can better represent them," said Rep. Delwin Jones of Lubbock, the sponsor.

The House devoted most of its morning session to debating a resolution commending migrant labor organizer Cesar Chavez, who is to speak here Saturday to backers of a furniture workers strike, most of them Mexican-Americans.
The resolution finally was adopted on a voice vote after an attempt by Rep. Bill Clayton of Springfield to consign it to a committee failed, 66-75.


