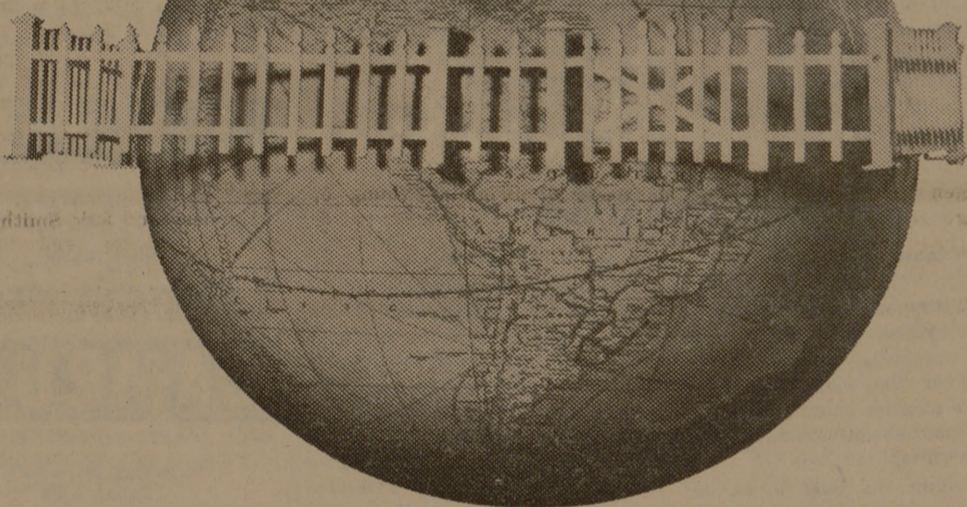

Physical education workshop for special child this Friday

A workshop on physical education and recreation for the special student will be held here Friday. Conducted by the Beaumont State Center for Human Development, the workshop will demonstrate recreational activities that can be enjoyed by the handicapped or mentally retarded child.

The Health and Physical Education Department will host the one-day event in G. Rollie White Coliseum.

"The workshop is not just for people in special education," noted Dr. John M. Chevette, clinic coordinator with Richard Smith of the Beaumont center.

"It is for anyone interested in helping the mentally retarded child," Chevette added. "Churches and various agencies that work in this area could find it beneficial."

Registration, for which no fee will be charged, will be at 8:30 a.m. in the White Coliseum lobby. Sessions begin at 9:15 a.m. with a keynote address, "Why Physical Education for the Handicapped," by Dr. Ted Powers, chairman of Baylor University's Health and Physical Education Department.

Demonstrations and a discussion of "Operation SHARP" (School Health and Recreation

Programs) will be conducted by Beaumont center staff members. Various activities will be demonstrated by Don Rink, BSCE recreation specialist; Sandy Livingston, center recreation and physical education director; Mrs. Ann Calvert, Austin public school teacher; Guy Owen, executive director, Texas Association for Retarded Children, and Dr. Virginia Horsman, BSCHD psychologist.

Smith, in charge of center program development, will discuss Operation SHARP and evaluate the clinic in the 3:15 final session. The Beaumont facility has a sister center at Amarillo.
