They read their books and magzines in braille and by listening records and magnetic tapes.

They are two of the 200,000 persons across the country who are enrolled in the Library of congress service for the blind and handicapped which marks its

40th anniversary this month. budget and now is a \$7.5-milliona-year-operation.

The library estimates there are 500,000 blind persons in this country and 1.5 million more who are physically handicapped so that they are unable to handle, hold or turn the pages of printed books and magazines. They too are eligible for the service, which




