Four guest speakers from Canada, Wisconsin and Minnesota are scheduled during the 1:30 to 5 p.m. symposium and open forum from 8 to 10 p.m. All meetings are open to the public in R&P Building Room 115.

The program is part of the department's visiting lecturer series.

Speakers are Dr. Jack B. Ellis, professor of environmental studies, York University, Toronto; Dr. Roy I. Wolfe, professor of geography, York University; Philip H. Lewis Jr., chairman, Landscape Architecture Depart-

ment of Wisconsin, and Donald G. Brauer, president, Brauer and Associates, Minneapolis.

Political Science prof wins fellowship

Dr. Bruce W. Robeck of the Political Science Department is among 16 winners in the American Political Science Association's 1971-72 congressional fellowship program.

The 31-year-old assistant professor was selected through national competition.

The program will extend from mid-November through Aug. 15, 1972. Dr. Robeck will spend the first six weeks in an orientation program and the remainder of the program will be split between House and Senate work on committees or with members of Congress.

He teaches classes in the legislative process and political behavior at A&M.

Officials of the association's rules division wrote the Berrien County coed and New Buffalo High School authorities that "girls cannot engage in sports where part or all of the membership of a participating team is composed of boys."

Jennifer said after reading her copy of the association's letter, "I think everyone just tried to brush me off." But, she added, that because she is a senior, she will drop the issue.

However, the coed went on to say, "I hope in the future other girls who are interested will pursue the matter of girls trying to get on the teams. But, they should start when they are freshmen."

The girl attended at least two of the team's tryouts but was rejected by the team's coach when she tried to sign as a player.
