## Peace Corps film will be shown tonight

"Hope and Harvest," a film on Peace Corps volunteers in Asia and Latin America, will be shown in room 3B of the Memorial Student Center at 7:30 tonight.  
The 30-minute film depicts Peace Corps workers in Kenya, India, Columbia, Chile and the Philippines.

Three Peace Corps representatives on campus this week are Branch Rickey, who worked in physical education in Venezuela, Sam Owens, a teacher in Guyana, and Cecilia Thompson, who worked in child care clinics in Ecuador.

The representatives have come to A&M in an effort to recruit Peace Corps volunteers. They are especially interested in people wanting to work with agriculture programs, land leveling projects, animal breeding, and forest station projects.

Rickey said that a college degree is not necessary to join the Peace Corps if a person has grown up on a farm or if he has two to five years experience in a skilled trade.
