Six members of the Texas Aggies are listed in the latest Southwest Conference baseball statistics released by the league this week, but at least three of the team's leading hitters are missing.

The list has two requirements that are hurting the Aggies. Dave Elmendorf, who has yet to play a conference game since his eye injury; and Gene Reinarz, who has batted only 11 times. Both lack the minimum 12 at bats for the list. Carroll Lilly is hitting only .238 in league play, but the list includes only .300 hitters. But the Aggie second baseman has a .414 season average with 19 hits in 37 bats against non-league opponents.
