Integrated flight instruction outlined by the FAA sets procedure for training new pilots in the use of instruments required in all aircraft. These inslude—along with the standard airspeed indicator, magnetic compass and altimeter-an artifical horizon, turn and bank indicator, directional gyro and vertical speed indicator.

The integrated method calls for the instructor to demonstrate a maneuver by visual and instrument reference, followed by student performance by visual and instrument reference, Richardson said. During instrument flight, the student wears a hood, a visored device to eliminate outside visual references.

"The student becomes more capable of flying IFR (instrument) conditions this way," said Richardson, who instructs 25 hours a week for the Texas A&M Aero Club.

It establishes good habits and leads to better monitoring of power settings and better maintenance of headings, altitude and

Richardson found agreement among fellow instructors that the integrated methods also presents difficulties.

Certain points need to be emphasized to different students because of character and ability differences. The student is often tense and unsure during the first familiarization flight, making it necessary to postpone integrated

"Time is the most critical element," Richardson said. "Student pilots incorrectly feel their flying ability is measured by how long it takes them to solo." Using the hood during initial stages of instruction takes time.

"Extended time to solo can canuse motivational failure and

student discouragement," h e claimed.

Other problems are over-reliance on instruments and overconfidence in aircraft handling. Some instructors feel that the student should first fully understand responses to airplane controls, Richardson said.

His method somewhat modifies enables the student to develop a presolo training. Flying by visual reference is given first, with complete coverage of aerodynamics and maneuver performance. The maneuver is then reintro- pilot."
