Eleven Texas A&M cadets were commissioned Air Force and Marine Corps officers Thursday and Friday.

The new officers completed degree and commissioning requirements this summer. A&M's Aerospace Studies Department offered senior Air Force ROTC courses for this summer, enabling the mid-year commissioning.

Six other officers were commissioned in July after the first summer session.

The oath was administered and bars presented by Col. Robert F. Crossland, professor of aerospace studies and ranking Air Force officer at A&M.
