Barnes to support research program

LT. Gov. Ben Barnes has pledged his support for a research program to wipe out bluetongue, a disease which primarily affects sheep but has severely restricted export of cattle. The lieutenant governor offered his support Aug. 25 during a bluetongue conference hosted by A&M's College of Veterinary Medicine.

Cattle industry leaders from throughout the state attended the session and passed a resolution officially calling for state support following Barnes' address. "I feel that in beef cattle alone, Texas is losing hundreds of millions of dollars as a result of the export restrictions caused by this disease," Barnes said.

Noting he thought Texas should take the lead in research to eradicate the disease, the lieutenant governor called for recommenda-

tions to be presented to the Legislature for financial support. Bluetongue is a virus infection in sheep that occasionally infects cattle. Infected cattle rarely show any ill effects, but 11 countries have some restrictions on imports from areas where the disease has been detected, and four countries—Australia, New Zealand, England and Ireland—have absolute ban on such imports.

The resolution, introduced by Scott Henderson of Houston, called for development of a vaccine for cattle, better methods for detection and related studies leading to greater understanding of the disease.

A&M's College of Veterinary Medicine was asked by the group to develop budgetary requirements for a comprehensive research program.

Bluetongue in cattle has been detected throughout the western portions of the United States, including Texas, pointed out Dr. Hugh E. Metcalf of the Animal Health Division of the U. S. Department of Agriculture's Research Service in Denver.

Dr. Metcalf was one of nine veterinary medicine and agricultural experts who discussed various aspects of the disease, including its history, incidence and distribution, diagnosis and research approaches.

Cooper makes challenges to new CSC leaders

Civilian student leaders were challenged at A&M to make 1971-72 school year decisions on the basis of the best interests of students they represent, rather than self-interests.

Edwin H. Cooper, assistant to President Jack Williams, issued two other challenges at a Civilian Student Council breakfast kicking off new student orientation.

President Williams also appeared briefly, introducing Lt. Gov. Ben Barnes who made brief remarks. Barnes was on campus for another conference.

Cooper told CSC officers and residence hall presidents they have the responsibility to inform students and expand programs that bring students together and identify them more closely with A&M.

"The average student doesn't know who to see about what," he commented.

Cooper noted that Williams' and his offices are open to student visits, but that in too many cases problems are not first being taken to proper officials.

Grant awarded for A&M study in sedimentation

A&M has been awarded a \$28,400 National Science Foundation grant for Gulf of Mexico and Caribbean sedimentation research.

Co-principal investigators for the study are Dr. Anthony F. Gangi, professor of geophysics, and Dr. Davis A. Fahliquist, association professor of geophysics and oceanography.

The grant, announced by Wilbur W. Bolton Jr. of the NSF offices in Washington, D. C., provides support for the project through February of 1973.

Using existing data, the two professors plan to employ computers in helping learn more about sedimentation and possibly crystalline rock beneath the floor in the deeper portions of the Gulf of Mexico and Western Caribbean.

They hope the study will provide a better understanding of the origin and geologic history of the two areas.

Drs. Gangi and Fahliquist will be assisted in the study by E. B. Stover, applied geophysicist in the Geophysics Department, and a graduate assistant.
