A&M, WTSU to offer cooperative MS

A&M and West Texas State University have entered into an agreement to offer a cooperative agronomy.

Dr. George W. Kunze, A&M graduate dean, said the agreement allows qualified West Texas State students to transfer a maximum of 12 hours of academic credit for an M.S. degree in agronomy awarded by A&M.

West Texas State does not offer graduate degrees in agronomy, while A&M has established programs on both the master's and doctoral levels.

The agreement between the two universities has been "heartily endorsed" by the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System, Dean Kunze

* * * Wainerdi co-editor of geochemical book

Dr. Richard E. Wainerdi, A&M's assistant vice president for academic affairs, is co-editor of a new book, "Modern Methods of Geochemical Analysis.'

The 397-page book, which includes contributions by three other A&M faculty members, was published by the Plenum Press of New York and London.

Dr. Wainerdi, who founded A&M's Activation Analysis Research Laboratory, edited the book with Dr. E. A. Uken, former graduate student here and now a member of South Africa's Scientific Advisory Council.

Dr. Herman A. Liebhafsky, professor of chemistry, wrote a chapter on X-ray techniques. Dr. Lloyd Fite, AARL associate head, and Dr. Emile A. Schweikert, associate professor of chemical engineering, contributed to a chapter on nuclear activation analysis.

The book includes a foreword by Sir Edward Bullard of Cambridge University, one of the world's foremost geoscientists.

From 20 to 30 children were evacuated to Bryan from the Texas Gulf coast and the path of Hurricane Fern.

Some rooms at the Central Brazos Valley Mental Health Center, Inc., needed to be cleaned up, so the duty nurse asked if some Aggies might help. The center is the old St. Joseph's

Executive Director Bob Cooper said little is known of where the arrangements are being made to accommodate as many as possible, though little is known of what to expect. "Within 10 minutes of the time

Corps Commander Tom Stanley heard about the request, he had a detail ready to go," a commandant's staff official said.

The detail was headed by Corps Sergeant Major Ron Krnavek. Reports indicate that the chil-

dren are being evacuated from a Lake Jackson orphanage. There were 25 Aggies involved in the clean-up project.
