Ags meet Tech in crucial test for both clubs

The Texas Aggies travel to the Panhandle tomorrow for a game that could key the remainder of the season for Coach Gene Stallings' crew.
With a 1-3 at this point, a win

over the Texas Tech Red Raiders could turn things around for A&M.

Boasting a strong defensive unit, experience, and a return threat in Hugh McElroy, but an offense that hasn't been consistent the last three times out, the Aggies will face a squad that had

picked up 518 yards on the ground in its 33-20 victory over USC.

Texas offense will be sub-par and the defense will be facing its toughest competition of the young season. This one will be a barn-burner.

Southern Methodist travels to Colorado Springs for an afternoon contest with the Air Force Falcons.

Texas-Oklahoma and Baylor-Arkansas battles headline fifth week of Southwest football

Week number five is upon us with another batch of touch-and-go games. For two teams it is the conference opener and for another, it is two straight weeks of "Super Bowl."

The Baylor Bears entertain the Arkansas Razorbacks in Waco for a night game. The Razorbacks are 1-0 in conference play with last week's convincing 49-15 humiliation of TCU. For the Bears, it will be the first SWC tilt of 1971. The Bears are 1-2 in non-conference with losses to Kansas and Miami and a victory over Indiana. Si Southall is out for the Bears this week but it really doesn't matter. Arkansas is getting ready for Big Shootout No. III next week in Little Rock against the Longhorns.

The annual fiasco is here already. Texas-OU weekend, which is usually the top money-making enterprise for the Dallas Police Dept., unveils itself at 2 p.m. in the Cotton Bowl. The game will be televised by KDFW in Dallas and Channel 7 in Austin (which can be picked up on the B-CS cable). This is the year for Oklahoma to do its thing as it is the senior year for such superlatives as Jack Mildren. For Texas it is the year of the sophomore and for this week, again, the Longhorns will be going without the services of top quarterback Eddie Phillips. The key to this game will be defenses of Texas. talks otherwise turned on caustic Communist assessments of the South Vietnamese presidential election Sunday and bitter invective addressed to Porter.

Porter recalled last Monday's U.S. House of Representatives resolution, which called for humane treatment of American prisoners, adherence to the Geneva Convention on prisoners of war and repatriation of the sick and wounded. He asked the Communists to provide information on American servicemen that North Vietnam and the Viet Cong "know to be dead."

The North Vietnamese spokesman, Nguyen Thanh Le, was asked by newsmen if Porter's request for information on dead American soldiers would be met. He referred to a list published by North Vietnam last December, which included 20 dead and 339 in prison camps. He asserted the list was still up to date.

U.S. officials fear that out of a total of 1,618 Americans Washington says are missing in Southeast Asia as many as 1,000 may be dead. While only 20 may have died in North Vietnamese prison camps, the United States feels that North Vietnam must have knowledge of many more dead. Some may have died in plane crashes during raids over North Vietnam.

U.S. seeks information about POW's in Vietnam

PARIS (AP)—The United States sought more information Thursday from the Communist Vietnamese about missing Americans.

On both points, raised at the Vietnam peace talks, U.S. Ambassador William J. Porter came away with what he considered incomplete answers or no answer at all.

The 131st session of the peace

Defensively, the Ags have Max Bird and Kent Finley at the ends, ahead of Mike Sweat and Dan Peoples. Boice Best and Van Odom, both having excellent years, are the tackles, with James Dubeak back from an injury. He was hurt in the LSU game, but

is ready for action this week. Bill Wiebold is the starting middle guard, and Odom may play some there, too.

The linebackers will be Steve Luebbehusen and Grady Hoermann, with Dennis Carruth and Mike Lord behind them. Lord will be playing for the first time since hurting his leg the week before the Nebraska game.

Lee Hitt, who has been a standout in the last two games, and Bland Smith are the cornerbacks. David Hoot and Brad Dusek will be at the safeties. All have played well thus far, and all are winners of the Aggie Star.

Mike Bellar will be kicking off, and Pat McDermott will be kicking placements. Robertson lost his conference punting lead last week, but he still has a fine 4.0 average.

The Aggies go to Jones Stadium with the hopes of repeating 1967, when the win over Tech started a seven-game winning streak and the conference and Cotton Bowl championships. Tech is already 0-1 in SWC play, having lost to Texas in Austin.
