Don Dean completed six of 13 passes for 91 yards and one touchdown. Frank Vavala led Fish receivers with four receptions for 52 yards.

The battle was purely offensive with both teams over 400 yards total offense. Baylor, in fact, led in total yards, 427 to 403.

Both teams lost a fumble but Baylor was stuck with two pass

interceptions. Robert Armstrong, highly touted schoolboy from Houston Sam Houston, did not fair as well as expected, hitting only two of eight passes with an interception.

After receiving the opening kickoff, the A&M Fish drove 72 yards in 13 plays for the first score. The drive was a steady ground attack with the longest play being a 14-yard run by John Bounds. Bounds was responsible for the score with a blast from the one. John Schluens kicked the extra point.

The Cubs ran but three plays before A&M got the ball back and covered 56 yards in 12 plays to the Baylor nine. Don Dean fumbled on the next play but recovered for a ten-yard loss. The Fish had to settle for a field goal by Schluens, making the score 10-0 with 3:01 left in the first quarter.

The first quarter ended with the Fish leading 10-0 and holding




