WASHINGTON (AP) - The Supreme Court agreed Tuesday to hear a Wisconsin case involving a college professor who said his contract was not renewed because he publicly criticized the college administration.

Earlier this year the court had agreed to hear the same issue in a Texas case.

In the latest case the Supreme Court agreed to hear the appeal of the Wisconsin Board of Regents of State Colleges which is seeking overturn of lower court decisions in favor of David F.






