



A&M harvests shrimp crops

Shrimp crops from A&M's mariculture ponds were harvested Monday for the last time before winter.

Twenty man-made ponds, located about 20 miles east of Angleton in Brazoria County, are used in the mariculture experiments, which aim at making shrimp farming a commercial

Support for the project is provided by A&M's Sea Grant Program, Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Brazoria County Mosquito Control District, Dow Chemical Company, Ralston Purina Company and Texaco, Inc.

Harvest results so far this season have ranged up to 250 pounds of shrimp per acre, noted Dr. Jack C. Parker, project di-

developed by Ralston Purina produced significantly improved growth rates in the shrimp," Parker reported.

Inorganic fertilizer was also used to encourage the growth of natural organisms upon which shrimp feed.

"Fertilizing accounted for better growth rates in the shrimp," Parker noted. "In addition, we found that using a 45 percent protein ration rather than a 35 percent protein content made very little difference. This is important in view of the cost of feeding."
