

Air Force presents medals to officers enrolled at A&M

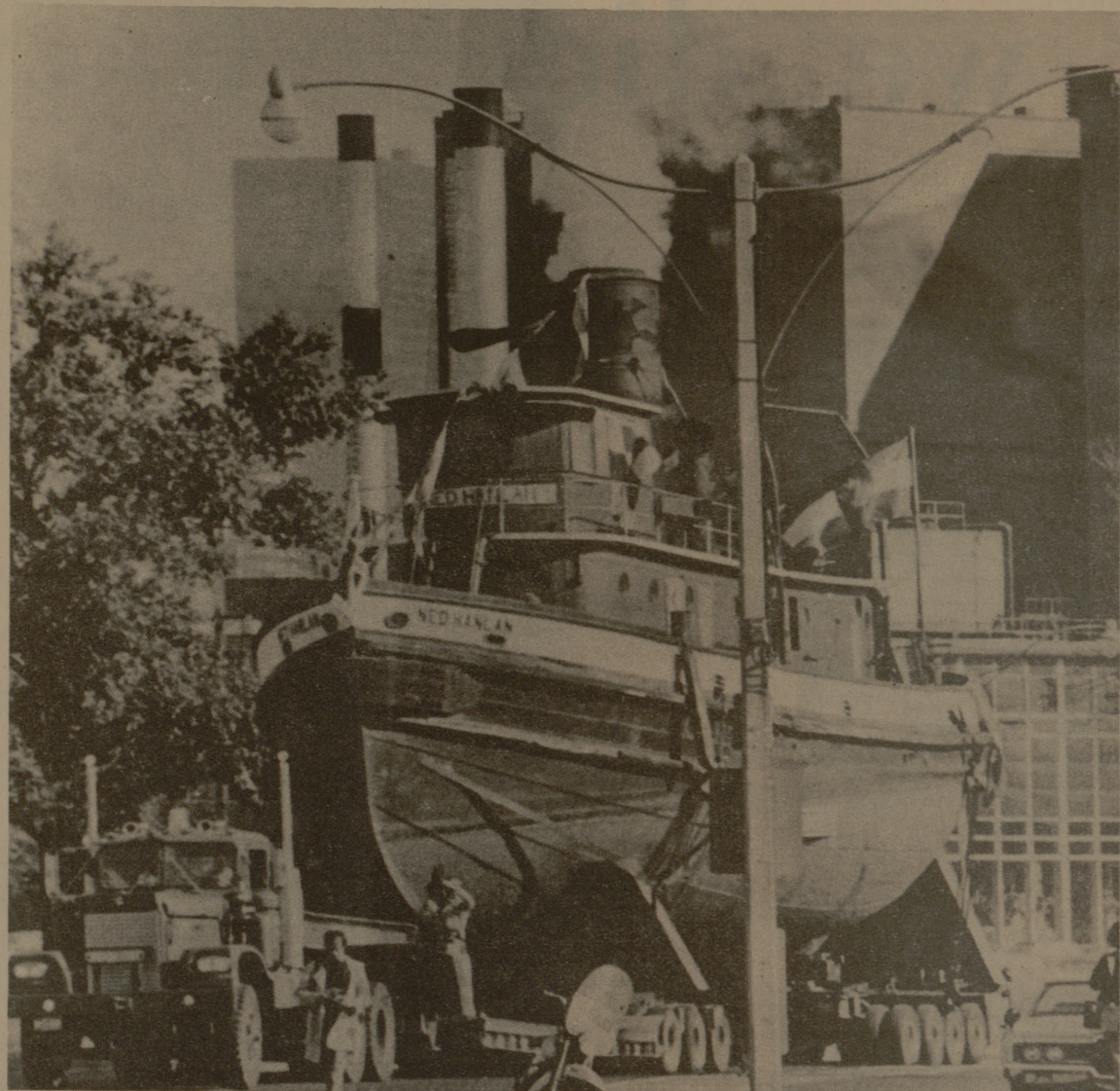
Air Force Commendation Medals and an Oak Leaf Cluster to the award have been presented to officers enrolled at A&M as graduate students on Air Force assignment.

Capt. Hanke received the first Oak Leaf Cluster to the Commendation Medal and citation for service at NASA's Manned Spacecraft Center in Houston.

A&M harvests shrimp crops

Shrimp crops from A&M's mariculture ponds were harvested Monday for the last time before winter.
Twenty man-made ponds, located about 20 miles east of Angleton in Brazoria County, are used in the mariculture experiments, which aim at making shrimp farming a commercial operation.
Support for the project is provided by A&M's Sea Grant Program, Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Brazoria County Mosquito Control District, Dow Chemical Company, Ralston Purina Company and Texaco, Inc.
Harvest results so far this season have ranged up to 250 pounds of shrimp per acre, noted Dr. Jack C. Parker, project director. Value of the shrimp on the market is between 80 and 90 cents per pound.
"A potentially commercial feed developed by Ralston Purina produced significantly improved growth rates in the shrimp," Parker reported.
Inorganic fertilizer was also used to encourage the growth of natural organisms upon which shrimp feed.
"Fertilizing accounted for better growth rates in the shrimp," Parker noted. "In addition, we found that using a 45 percent protein ration rather than a 35 percent protein content made very little difference. This is important in view of the cost of feeding."
Problems still exist, however, in the mariculture experiments. Parker cited high mortality rates as the biggest one yet to be solved.
"Disease, predators and improper pond management have resulted in mortality rates ranging from 30 to 80 percent. Also, it's difficult to determine feeding rates when the survival of the shrimp cannot be estimated," he explained.
