A&M Professors present paper

A paper concerning water pollution control and use of water resources was presented at the annual meeting of the American Water Resources Association in Washington, D. C. recently. The paper, entitled "Integrated Management of Quantity and Quality of Urban Water Resources", was authored by Dr. C. S. Shih, associate professor, and Dr. W. L. Meier, Jr., professor, both of the department of industrial engineering at A&M.

The paper presents a total water quality-quantity management approach to the use of water resources, including cost factors. The paper will be published in the Water Resources Bulletin, the journal of the American Water Resources Association.

Dr. Charles E. McCandless, associate dean of liberal arts at A&M, will attend the 24th annual National Orientation Directors Conference Nov. 7-9 at Oklahoma State University.
