

Devaney claims Cornhuskers will keep top ranking

The Associated Press Nebraska Coach Bob Devaney Tuesday that his top-ranked Cornhuskers will play No. 2 Oklahoma Thanksgiving Day with respect for a fine Oklahoma team but with the idea that they going to stay No. 1."

The Cornhuskers remained top the weekly Associated Press college football poll with 40 first-place votes and a season high 986 points from a panel of 55 sports writers and broadcasters. The Sooners held onto the second spot with eight first-place votes

and 986 points. Both teams remained undefeated last week, Nebraska crushing Kansas State 44-17 and Oklahoma humiliating Kansas 56-10. Michigan remained third with four No. 1 ballots and 788 points while Alabama, Auburn and Penn State polled one first place vote each as the fourth, fifth and sixth-ranked teams.

The only other undefeated team in the top 20 is No. 13 Toledo, which like Nebraska, Michigan and Alabama is 10-0. Oklahoma, Auburn and Penn State are 9-0.

Rounding out the top 10 are Notre Dame, No. 7, followed by Georgia, Arizona State and Colorado. Idle Tennessee held onto the 11th spot followed by Texas, Toledo, Louisiana State, Southern California, Houston, Arkansas, Stanford, Michigan State and Mississippi.

Auburn and Alabama, along with Nebraska and Oklahoma, are idle this Saturday awaiting Thanksgiving weekend showdowns.

Nov. 27, two days after the Sooners and the Cornhuskers clash in Norman, Okla.

Named the Elephant Bowl, proceeds will go to the Brazos Valley Mental Health Association.

The game is the idea of Mike Weynand, and from the beginning plans have gone smoothly. Several university officials were consulted, and permission for cooperation was granted.

Dean of Students James P. Hennigan gave the okay for the student function. Richard C. "Pack" Weirus has helped with the planning, in addition to aiding the publicity program. Athletic Director Gene Stallings and Marvin Tate, his assistant, are getting the students use Kyle Field and varsity football equipment for the game.

The teams have been working

out on the lighted softball field from 7-9 every night for a week and a half. There are 40-45 cadets on each squad. Coaches for the game are Tom Burnett and Ozzie Burke for the Army and Stan Friedli and Merrill Ham for the Air Force.

In the interest of safety, an insurance policy on all players has been purchased. Certain plays, such as defensive blitzes will not be used. Faculty and staff members who are professional referees have volunteered to officiate the game.

Tom Potthoff and Larry Gallego are in charge of running and planning the game. Publicity chairmen are Jan Berthoff and John Hobson.

"Everyone has been helpful in getting us started on plans for the Elephant Bowl," Hobson said in announcing the game. "We appreciate all the cooperation we've received thus far."

Admission for the game will be 50¢ for A&M students.

bowl contract in its pocket."

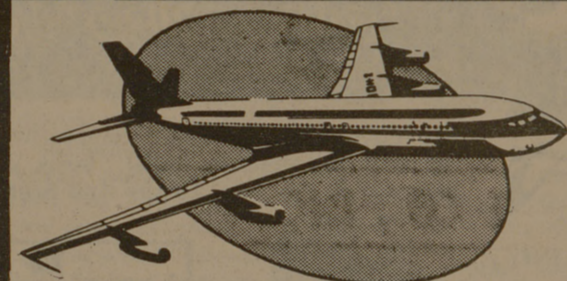
NCAA regulations prohibit signing of teams prior to 6 p.m., local time, Saturday although Notre Dame has been eligible to commit itself all week since the Irish wind up the regular season a week early.

Third-ranked Michigan, 10-0, and No. 18 Stanford 7-3, are set for the Rose Bowl and the Southwest Conference king — either Texas, Arkansas or Texas A&M — will half fill the Cotton Bowl.

Alabama carries a 10-0 record against Auburn, 9-0, in their Nov. 27 game in Birmingham.

Thus, it shaped up as a massive gamble for both the Orange and Sugar Bowls since either could wind up with two undefeated teams or two outfits who lost their final games.

Georgia, 9-1, has a game remaining Thanksgiving night against Georgia Tech.
