SAN ANTONIO, Texas (AP) - gating organized crime. Spokes-Police guarded a hospital Wednesday to protect a Senate investigator who was beaten and robbed of valuable papers while on a mission here to probe organized crime.

William B. Gallinaro, 44, described as a crack investigator for the Senate Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations, was in good condition and under observation, officials said.
