Luebbehusen is nominated for Kern Tipps Trophy

 Steve Luebbehusen has been named by Texas A&M Athletic Director Gene Stallings as the Aggies' nominee for the Fourth Kern Tipps Award.

The award is given annually for the outstanding senior football player of the Southwest Conference who has shown the greatest amount of leadership, scholarship and character both on and off the field. Last year's winner was Arkansas tailback Bill Burnett and in 1969 Texas A&M's Buster Adami was awarded the trophy.

The winner of the award, which is sponsored by Humble Oil Company, will be announced Dec. 8.

Luebbehusen has been a stalwart in the linebacking corps at Texas A&M for the past three years. As a freshman Steve was named All-SWC at linebacker and has started for the varsity ever since. He is a graduate of Fort Worth Eastern Hills where he topped All-State honors. He is a finance major with a 3.1 grade-point-ratio.

Other nominees include Gary Hammond, Southern Methodist; Steve Judy, Texas Christian; Ron Evans, Baylor; Jim Bertelson, Texas; Larry Molinaire, Texas Tech; Jack Morris, Arkansas and Stahle Vincent, Rice.

Hammond has been consensus All-SWC for two years at two different positions. As a sophomore, he played split end and last year he ran the tailback slot. This year he is trying his third different position, that of quarterback. He has led the conference in pass receiving the past two seasons and was the fourth leading rusher in the SWC last year with 891 yards. In 1969, Hammond was named the SWC Soph-

omore of the year. If he makes all conference again this year, he will be only the 20th player in conference history to make it three years in a row and the first to make it at three different positions.

Judy led the SWC in total offense as a sophomore with 2,019 yards. That year he was named to Football News' Sophomore All-American and academic All-SWC. In 1970 he won a spot on the Churchman's All-America team and as a freshman was named All-SWC both ways. He has started 20 of TCU's past 21 games, missing one because of an ankle injury. In his two varsity years, Judy has amassed 3,521 total yards and scored 60 points. Steve is married and majors in business.

Evans gave up a chance at dental school to complete his eligibility this season. The 6-6, 245 offensive tackle played in 747 plays last year while grading over 90 per cent in 10 of 11 games,

making second team All-SWC. Ron is a bona fide All-American choice from Amarillo, Texas High.

Bertelson has been starting halfback in the Texas Tech lineup for three years. In 1969 he had all rushers with 740 yards and 12 touchdowns and tied the school record with four against SMU. Destined to be consensus All-SWC pick and high on the list for All-America honors, Jim is an avid follower of quarter horses and a finance major from Hudson, Wisconsin.

Molinaire in preseason was picked consensus All-SWC and expected to make a run at All-American honors from his linebacking spot. The Midland La. High School standout has started for the Raiders for three years now and leads the team in tackles. Larry is a business major and married.

Morris earned a starting position his first year out for the Arkansas Razorbacks after he transferred from Hutchinson (Kansas) Junior College where he took All-Jayhawk and All-American honors at split end and safety. He played only one year in high school and led the team to state championship. Jack is married and has a degree in education.

Vincent was tabbed a "national blue chipper" from Greensboro (North Carolina) Dudley High. Last year he was the Owl's top rusher with 464 yards which was good enough for eighth in the conference. As a sophomore, Stahle played quarterback before taking over the tailback slot late in the season. He took charge in the classroom also, being named as a President's Honor Roll scholar.
