The Aggies had 30 rebounds in the second half, compared to 21 for TCU. Simpson Degrate lived up to his billing as one of the best in the league by dumping in 22 points. The 6-4 senior hit seven of 18 from the field and converted eight of 13 from the free throw line. He led all rebounders with 13

It was a big night for the Aggies, getting them back on the winning side after Saturday's loss to Arkansas. The biggest crowd of the season, 4,562, was on hand for Tuesday night's game. The Aggie Band keyed the excitement, and the team responded with its sixth win in G. Rollie White Coliseum this year.


