"We wil give participants basic knowledge and understanding of the physics of diving," Fife said. "With this they will nail down a problem for investigation."

He indicated the two-part program will provide an accelerated study of human body systems most affected by the underwater environment, emphasizing physiological changes which occur under increased (hyperbaric) pres-

SCUBA training conducted for the program by the Health and Physical Education Department will consist of lecture and actual diving experience. Students completing the course may receive a certified diver's card, signify-

Geyer noted ONR support of the university's oceanographic program now totals more than \$4 million during the past five years.
