Kudrle appointed representative

Robert T. Kudrle of A&M's Economics Department has been appointed the institution's new Rhodes Scholarship representative, announced Dr. John C. Cal-

houn, TAMU vice president for academic affairs.

Kudrle, who is completing degree requirements for a Ph.D. from Harvard, joined the TAMU faculty last fall as a lecturer.

Major unit commanders for '72-'73 Corps named

Major unit commanders in A&M's 1972-73 Corps of Cadets are juniors Thomas D. Newsome of Marfa, Robert J. Miller of Brecksville, Ohio, Fidel Rodriguez of Bishop, Andrew R. Brosh of Shiner, and Paul C. Herrington, Palestine.

Newsome and Miller will command the First and Second Brigades, respectively; Rodriguez and Brosh, First and Second Wings, and Herrington, the Texas Aggie Band, Col. Thomas R. Parsons, commandant, announced.

The new commanders were recommended by the 1972-73 corps commander, Ronald L. Krnavek of Corpus Christi; deputy commander Wade Seidel of Brenham, and military advisers to the commandant.

Brigade and wing commanders hold the rank of cadet colonel. The band commander is a lieutenant colonel.

Brigades are composed of three battalions of three or four Army ROTC companies each. Each wing includes three groups of three or four Air Force ROTC squadrons. The Aggie Band consists of two company-size units for administrative purposes.

Rodriguez is a civil engineering major and corps scholastic sergeant this year. He was formerly in Squadron 4. A mechanical engineering major, Brosh is Second Wing sergeant major out of Squadron 11.

Sergeant major of the First Brigade, Newsome is studying agricultural economics and was Company I-1. Miller is the cadet non-commissioned officer of the Second Brigade. He is a management major and previous was in Company F-2.

Also a management major, Herrington is band sergeant major and member of the White Band organization which seeks to demonstrate bicycling as a healthy, non-polluting sport and as a practical means of community transportation.

A&M employee insurance rates will increase

A hospitalization insurance rate increase for A&M System employees will go into effect Sept. Personnel Director H. Ray Smith announced.

The increase, affecting 5,000 TAMUS employees, is the result of rising medical costs, Smith said.

Smith explained hospitalization rates will increase \$1 per month if only the employee is insured \$2 for an employee and one dependent and \$3 for an employee and two or more dependents. Medicare premium rates will increase 75c per month per insured.

"Because of the outstanding benefits of the TAMU System group hospitalization program we feel that an employee will continue to receive better coverage at less cost than he could obtain through an individual policy," Smith emphasized.


