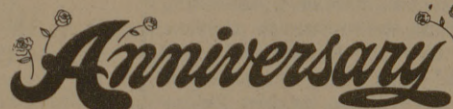

In a recent interview TSEA president Bruce Brant said the purpose of the organization is to provide a focal point for all education majors and sponsor a professional organization in the teaching profession for those intending to pursue a teaching career.

"Membership in TSEA has proved beneficial to students entering student teaching in local schools," Brant added. "The student teachers have learned a lot of teaching tips in our TSEA meetings they have been able to put into practice during their student teaching assignments."

Dr. Philip Limbacher, an assistant professor in the Curriculum & Instruction Department, is the faculty adviser for the group.

"TSEA has made me more of a professional and has awakened my interest in teaching," Brant said.

The club will meet tonight at 7:30 p.m. in Nagle Hall in Room 113. Officers for next year will be elected.

If the A&M police were inhuman and went strictly by the book, officer Wesley Quitta said, "we'd have every Aggie in jail."

Quitta, 21 and married, joined the KK on Jan. 3. In a recent interview he blamed the current negative opinion of the police on a lack of communication.

"After a student has had dealings with us, his attitude usually changes," he said. "I think they ought to try to meet us. I think they will find we're not such cut-throats."

He said a student under 21 found with alcohol is almost always given the choice of pouring

it out in lieu of arrest.

Asked if he had taken part in unauthorized searching, he said, "for my part, no." When finding a suspicious situation, he said, "first thing we're going to do is get a warrant."

How about harassment of the KK by students?

This comes from "not really a group, just certain individuals," he said. "They do just because they don't understand what our job is out here."

He said he didn't mind the name "pig" except when preceded by certain unprintable adjectives. "If they (students) can make you mad, it's a feather in

their caps. You've got to let them know it doesn't bother you."

Quitta said he wished the students would realize that cops are human, too. "Most people think just because we put on a badge, we can't go out and have a good time."

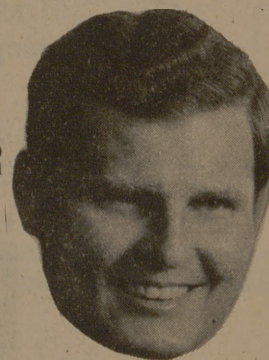
