And a spokesman in the state comptroller's office says the state 19, 1969, to March 21, 1972. could foreclose on one of the companies for failure to pay franchise taxes.

The Associated Press revealed Sunday that Hull paid \$2,625 from his legislative contingency to Astro Office Supply Co. over a 21month period. The story also said Astro took in at least \$2,915 in rentals from seven other House members.

Hull denied any wrongdoing despite a provision in the state Constitution forbidding legislators to be "interested, either directly or indirectly, in any contract with the state . . ."

Hull, of Fort Worth, said Astro "merged with Commercial Office Supply about two years ago."

Asst. Secretary of State Bill Bowers said Tuesday that if that is true "they should have filed articles of merger for both corporations."

No articles of merger have been filed with the secretary of state's office for either company, an inspection showed.

Hull claimed he saved the state money by renting the furnishings for less than other companies would have rented them.

Both he and former Rep. Jack McLaughlin, a fellow incorporator of Astro, said the figures in The AP story were incorrect.
