

Englert has hit in all 12 of the league games this year, and should he continue

that string through the Rice series, he will tie an SWC record. Englert has 24 league hits in 52 trips to the plate. He is first in hits, tied for third in doubles, tied for fifth in runs batted in

and tied for fifth in runs scored. As a team, the Aggies are hitting .296 in league play. They are second in runs scored (78), second in hits (125), second in runs batted in (61) and third in doubles (17). Texas leads in all these categories with a .329 average, 91 runs, 131 hits, 80 runs batted




