AUSTIN (AP) - When Preston Smith said Wednesday that Ben Barnes and Frances Farenthold perhaps should resign for nepotism, he apparently forgot he hired Speaker Rayford Price's wife in 1965.

Senate payroll records show Barbara Price was paid \$1,680 for working for Smith from Feb. 1, 1965 to May 31, 1965, when Smith was lieutenant governor.

"Maybe Ben Barnes and Sissy Farenthold should resign," the governor said in Brownsville. After suggesting it, he said: "I'm not suggesting it, but it should be looked into."

Smith's remarks were prompted by the resignation of Sen. David Ratliff of Stamford, who hired several of his own relatives while he was in the legislature.
