Aggie rodeo team qualifies for national championships

An eight-man team will represent Texas A&M at the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association's National Rodeo Finals June 20-24 in Bozeman, Montana.

The team is made up of Don Graham, David Hammit, John Welch, Nick Burnham, Lew Rust, Dan Gamblin, George Vance and Keith Chapman.

The meet is jointly sponsored by the NIRA, with headquarters in Huntsville and Montana State University.

The Rodeo Finals matches the top rodeo cowboys and cowgirls from nine regions throughout the Western United States. The contestants will be competing for top places and awards which consist of trophies, saddles, gold and silver buckles, prize money and other awards along with national recognition for themselves and their school.

The A&M team qualified for the finals by finishing in the top two teams in the Southern Region of the NIRA which encompasses schools from South and East Texas and Southern Louisiana.

All of the team members placed high in their respective events which include saddle bronc, bareback bronc, bull riding, tiedown and calf roping and steer wrestling.

In order to qualify, these cowboys had to collect the most points from the team's five best rodeos during the spring competition.

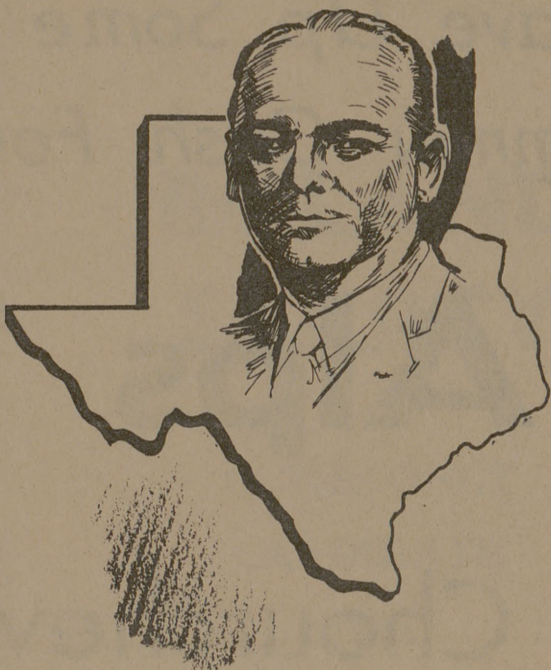
