

OU's Mildren to be in All-America Game

Patriots trade tackle Antwine to Philadelphia for Bill Hobbs

The New England Patriots announced last week that they had acquired linebacker Bill Hobbs from the Philadelphia Eagles in a trade for veteran defensive tackle Houston Antwine.

Hobbs, who was All-American at A&M, played for the Aggie team which won the Southwest Conference championship and de-

feated Alabama in the 1968 Cotton Bowl. He has played mostly on the specialty teams at Philadelphia, and last season was named the Associated Press Defensive Player of the Week for his performance on the punt return team.

Antwine has been named to the American League All-Star team seven times in his career.

Jack Mildren, Oklahoma's star quarterback, heads a list of 21 new signees for the Coaches All-America Game scheduled June 24 in Texas Tech's Jones Stadium.

Mildren will play for his college coach Chuck Fairbanks who will be directing the West squad. Signing with Mildren for the West team were two of his teammates, Albert Qualls, a 6-2, 222-pound linebacker, and John Shelley, a 6-0, 195-pound defensive back.

Mildren earned himself the reputation at Oklahoma of being probably the best triple-option quarterback in the country. He

rushed for 1,140 yards, more than any quarterback in the NCAA has ever gained running in a season. An exceptional runner with 4.6 speed, Mildren also can hit the pass when necessary. Last fall he hit 64 completions for 878 yards, including 10 touchdown bombs.

Also joining the West team were Dave Dalby, a center from UCLA, Marvin Bateman, punter from the University of Utah; Larry Jacobson, a defensive lineman from Nebraska; Ed Gallagher, defensive lineman from UCLA; Jim LeClair, linebacker

from North Dakota; Willie Buchanan, defensive back from San Diego State; and Ralph McGill, defensive back from Tulsa.

Signing in with Coach Bear Bryant's East eleven were three University of Michigan stars, Glenn Doughty, flanker; Mike Taylor, linebacker; and Tom Darden, defensive back.

Inking with Bryant from Michigan State were Eric Allen, a flanker, and Ron Curl, a defensive lineman.

Other East signees included John Yochum, offensive tackle from Syracuse; Tom Luken, of-

fensive guard from Purdue; Lewis Jolley, runningback from North Carolina; Elmer Allen, defensive lineman from Mississippi; Bo Davies, defensive back from the University of Southern California; and Ernie Jackson, defensive back from Duke.

Already announced as playing for Fairbanks' West team are Larry Molinare, linebacker from Texas Tech; Gary Hammond, quarterback, SMU; John Vella, offensive lineman, USC; Willie Hall, linebacker, USC; Tom Mozi-sek, runningback, Houston, Jerry Tagge, quarterback, Nebraska;

Jeff Kinney, runningback, Nebraska; Jack Turnbull, center, Oregon State; Bernard Jackson, runningback, Washington State; Roosevelt Manning, defensive lineman, Northeast Oklahoma State.

Already announced for Bryant's East team are Ron Estay, defensive lineman, LSU; John Anderson, center, Lehigh; Lionel Antwan, offensive tackle, Southern Illinois; Royce Smith, offensive guard from Georgia; Gene Hunt, kicker, Tennessee, and Tom McMakin, tight end from Oklahoma State.

The pair from Ghana, both of whom are members of the Ghana National track team, are T. B. Yemme and Adolph Tingan. They compete in the 880, mile, three-mile and six-mile events.

The Houston schoolboys are Paul Goodman of Milby who has run a 4-19.2 in the mile and Harold Davis of Jones High who is a quartermiler and halfmiler.

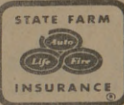
She added the university's corporate membership shows A&M supports the goals and actions of AAUW and wishes to publicly recognize the organization.
