

A&M faculty have key role at conference

A&M faculty members will have key roles in the School Administrators and Supervisors Conference here June 12-14.

Sixteen professors and administrators will participate in group sessions as leaders and resource personnel.

The three-day conference will

have major speakers on topics related to "Renewal of Americanism Through Community Involvement" plus 30 small group discussions on a variety of issues relevant to today's public school education.

More than 500 county and school superintendents and instructional

supervisors are expected.

Dr. John C. Calhoun Jr., vice president for academic affairs, will welcome participants. He and special platform guests will be introduced by Dr. Frank Hubert, dean of the College of Education, at the first general assembly.

Group leaders from TAMU are Dr. Donald L. Clark, education associate dean for research; Dr. Daniel C. Pfannstiel, Agricultural Extension Service associate director; Dr. James L. Boone, industrial education head; Dr. Arnold Ashburn, educational ad-

ministration; Dr. O. M. Holt, agricultural education; Dr. Don Seaman, Adult Education director; Dr. Delmar Janke, curriculum and instruction, and Dr. Robert I. Berridge, Community Education Center director.

Berridge will also sit on a panel. Resource persons for the groups will include Dr. T. M. Stinnett, educational administration; Dr. Joseph Ilika, Reading Lab director in curriculum and instruction; Dr. Carol Anderson and Dr. Robert Reilly, educational psychology; Mrs. Gayle Schmidt, health

and physical education; Dr. Richard Baldauf, wildlife and fisheries sciences; Dr. Richard E. Thomas, Urban Program Center director, and Dr. David Ruesink, extension sociologist.

The conference is coordinated by educational administration faculty including Dr. Harold L. Hawkins, head; Dr. L. S. Richardson, Dr. Paul R. Hensarling, Ashburn and Berridge.

Twenty-two education graduate students are serving as group hosts-recorders and coordinator assistants.

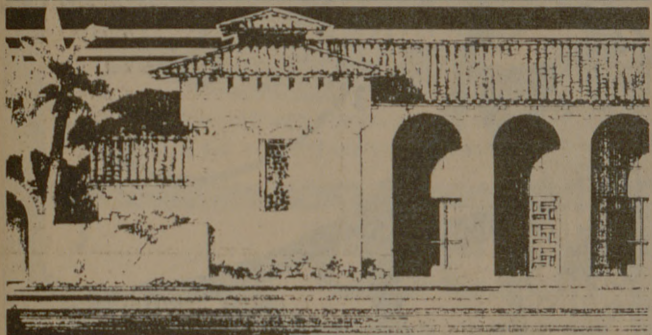

Scholarship grant donated to Poultry Science Dept.

A scholarship grant to A&M has been announced by Dow Chemical U.S.A. and Southern Feed Co., Center, Texas. The grant, designated for the university's Poultry Science Department, is in the amount of \$570.

More than \$50,000 in similar grants is being given this year to colleges and universities in a program jointly supported by Dow and the poultry feed industry. Most of the grants are aimed to assist young people who plan careers in the poultry field.
