"Naturally, we regret Gabrel's leaving and we wish him well in his new position," Bellard said. "At the same time, we feel that Rex Norris will be a valuable addition to our staff.'

The changes brought about a slight reshuffling of coaching assignments. Swede Lee moves from the freshman staff to replace Gabrel as defensive ends coach for the varsity, while Norris joins head freshman coach Paul Register and backfield coach Donnie Wigginton on the freshman staff.

Norris grew up in San Angelo where he was a guard-linebacker at Central High from where he was graduated in 1958.
