

# Copp will head Sociology Dept.

Dr. James H. Copp has joined the A&M faculty in dual administrative capacities for the Colleges of Agriculture and Liberal Arts.

Copp heads the Department of Sociology and Anthropology and is associate head of the Department of Agricultural Economics and Rural Sociology.

His appointment, effective June 1, was jointly announced by Liberal Arts Dean W. David Maxwell and Agricultural Dean H. O. Kunkel.

The former human resources branch chief with the U. S. Department of Agriculture in Washington, D. C., will have charge of the total teaching program in sociology and anthropology. In agriculture, Dr. Copp will have charge of research and extension programs carried out by rural sociologists through the Texas

Agricultural Experiment Station and Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

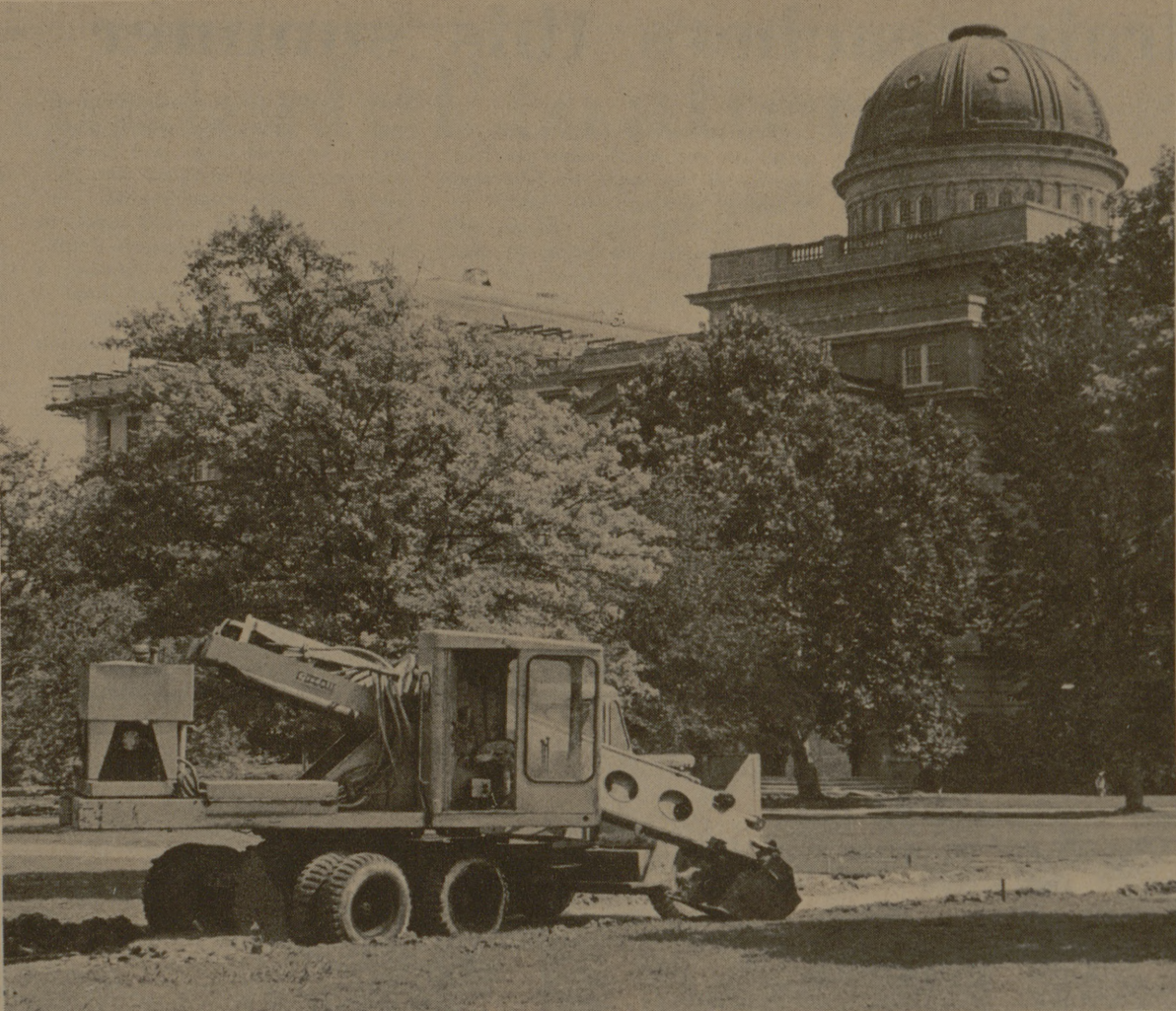
Copp, 47, formerly taught at Kansas State, the University of Wisconsin and Penn State. He joined the USDA Economic Development Division-Economic Research Services branch in 1967.

He succeeds acting head Dr. Robert L. Skrabanek in the Sociology and Anthropology Department, created in the fall of 1970. The two-year-old academic department has a professional faculty of 14 and 226 majors, of which 16 are Ph.D. candidates and 180 are undergraduates.

Dr. Copp received the bachelor and master's degrees in sociology at the University of Minnesota and completed the Ph.D. at Wisconsin in 1954. A full professor before leaving Penn State, he was technical leader there of an agency for International Development study program in rural community work involving students of Africa, Asia and Latin America.

Copp is president of the Rural Sociological Society, member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and an American Sociological Association fellow.

The Minnesota native grew up on a family dairy and grain farm near Thief River Falls. He is married and has five children.

# Cooper new admissions dean

Heaton became the university's first dean of admissions and records when the position was created in 1969. He was appointed registrar in 1941, with his title changed to director of admissions and registrar in 1956. He earned his undergraduate degree at Stephen F. Austin in 1929 and

master's at A&M in 1936, two years after he was named assistant registrar.

As registrar and dean of admissions and records, Heaton has signed more than 50,000 diplomas — or nearly 90 percent of the total conferred during A&M's 96-year history.

In regard to the United Chest drive, Cooper said that an arrangement has been made allowing A&M faculty, staff and students to decide what percentage of their donations will go to the College Station fund and how much will go to the United Fund in Bryan. The reason for this is the overlap in populations.

Announcement of the goal for the United Chest will be made prior to the drive in October. A kickoff breakfast will precede the drive.

"I'm looking forward to working with the United Chest Board of Directors," Cooper said. "I hope to learn a lot from the past chairmen. We want to have a good personal contact with all the people involved to make the drive successful."
