

Two veterinarians honored for teaching and research

The Texas Veterinary Medical Association has honored two A&M faculty members for dedication to teaching and research.

Honored during the College of Veterinary Medicine Honors Convocation Friday night were Dr. Richard M. Robinson, who received the award for research, and Dr. Larry D. Claborn, recipient of the TVMA teaching award. Both received cash awards and plaques.

Dr. Claborn, associate profes-

sor of veterinary physiology and pharmacology, is a native of Smith County. He was valedictorian at Troup High School and earned a B.S. degree from Abilene Christian College before coming to A&M to earn the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree.

He also holds a master's degree from Baylor College of Medicine.

Dr. Claborn served as a captain in the Air Force Veterinary Service. He conducted research at the Southwest Research Foundation

in San Antonio and was a post-doctoral fellow at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

He joined the veterinary college here in 1967.

Dr. Claborn serves as a counselor to the pre-veterinary students and is a member of several student-faculty relations committees.

His memberships include the AVMA, TVMA, American Society of Veterinary Physiologists and Pharmacologists and the Ameri-

can Association of Laboratory Animal Science.

Dr. Robinson is associate professor of veterinary pathology. He is a 1962 DVM graduate of A&M and joined the faculty as an instructor immediately after graduation.

He is head of the Wildlife Diseases Laboratory.

Earlier studies were at Palomar Junior College in San Marcos, Calif.; Arizona State, where he received a B.S. degree, and the

University of Texas at Austin. He holds a M.S. in veterinary pathology from TAMU.

In 1965, he received the Wildlife Conservation Award from the Sportsman's Club of Texas. His research experience includes work at the Poisonous Animals Research Laboratory at Tempe, Arizona, and technical work for A&M's Oceanography and Meteorology Department.

Dr. Robinson is an active teacher, productive researcher and na-

tional leader in wildlife disease.

Dean A. A. Price pointed out He is the author of 28 publications and a popular speaker at civic and sportsmen's clubs. He is active in the Wildlife Diseases Association, AVMA, TVMA, Texas Wildlife Society and the American College of Veterinary Pathologists.

His wife, Dr. Dorothea Robinson, practices veterinary medicine in College Station.

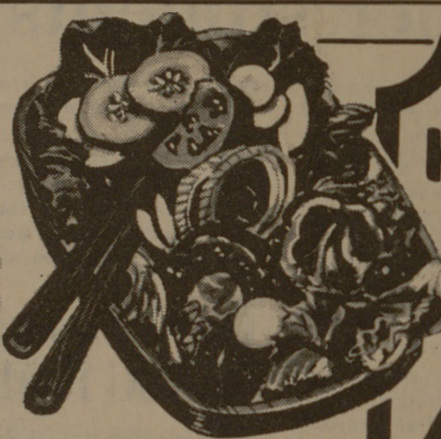
