

Record number enrolled for industrial firefighting

A record 1,001 industrial firemen, instructors and equipment manufacturer's representatives registered Monday for the start of the one-week Industrial Firemen's Training School at A&M.

Industrial workers enrolled as students hit 817 Monday afternoon, up 76 from last year's record.

Two 36-hour industrial fire-

fighting courses are offered, with heavy emphasis on the use of new chemical agents to extinguish fires quickly.

The annual industrial banquet is Thursday night. A special fire demonstration and equipment display for industry is scheduled for 8 a.m. Friday at Brayton Firemen Training Field, he added.

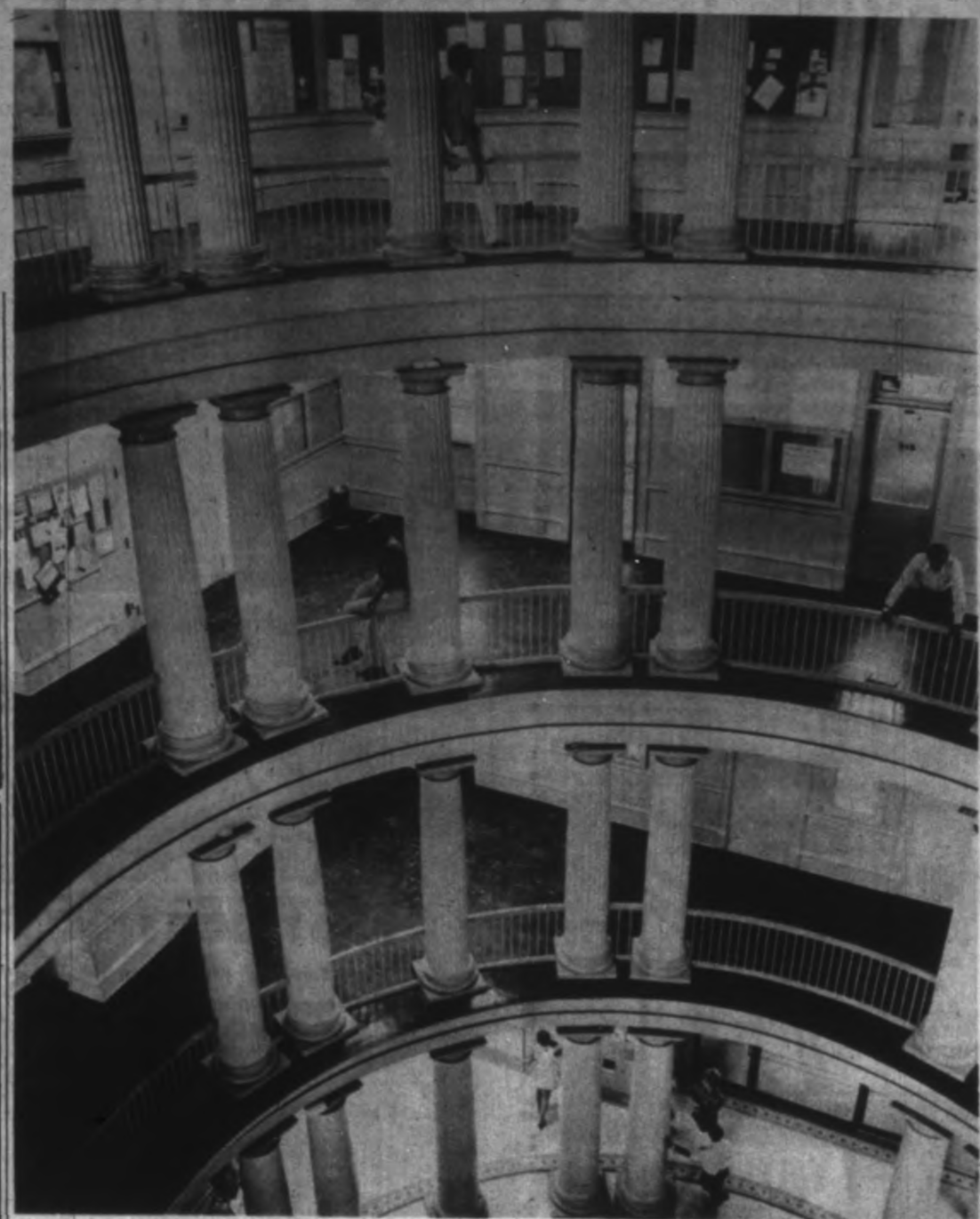

papers. A member of the TAMU faculty since 1964, Dr. Bowers was promoted to full professor in 1967. He was assistant publisher of the Pennsylvania paper prior to joining the university. He previously taught at Texas Tech University.
