

Oilers host Bears in Post's Charity Game

Opening the 1972 home season of the Houston Oilers is the sixth annual Houston Post Charity Game, to be played in the Astrodome August 10 at 7:30 p.m. This year's opponents are the Chicago Bears.

Last year's crowd of 45,411 was a record for this philanthropic event.

The game is sponsored by The Houston Post Charities, Inc., a non-profit organization established to help raise funds for Houston charities. Over the past five years, more than \$100,000 has been donated to selected charities as a result of this organization and its Charity Game.

In this sixth year of offering a professional sports event with community benefit, Houston Post Charities has another great combination of challenging football teams.

The Bears — and middle linebacker Dick Butkus, in particular — are noted for physically demanding games. In spite of this "wrecking crew" reputation, they are faced with the Oilers' 2-1 edge in the record of the teams' past three confrontations.

The Oilers are eager to make that record 3-1, especially with their new coach, Bill Peterson, at the sidelines. This incentive, plus their experienced rookies of last year and new uniforms, should make the Oilers a worthy match for the Bears.

The recipients of this year's game proceeds are Big Brothers of Houston and the Neighborhood Centers-Day Care Association, both United Fund affiliates. Former A&M players in the game will be Ross Brupbacher, a third year linebacker for the Bears, and David Hoot, a rookie safety for the Oilers. Houston picked Hoot up after he was cut by the Los Angeles Rams.

Englert had a career batting average of .396 at A&M. He was signed by the National League Giants after being selected by them in the free agent draft held in June.
