Peace Corps teacher to be here

A&M students interested in Peace Corps or VISTA service may obtain information next week from a former Peace Corps teacher in East Africa.

Wayne Judkins will take questions and supply applications at a booth in the Memorial Student Center on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

He taught English language and literature to 500 secondary

boarding school boys in Masindi, Uganda.

"Teaching in a foreign country can be a very rewarding experience," Judkins commented. "Working with students who have a great motivation for learning and living in a culture different from their own increases awareness of the world and of oneself."

He said work in VISTA provides a valuable learning experience and that helping people in

low income communities will alleviate problems.

Judkins indicated people in all academic areas are encouraged to check into VISTA and Peace Corps possibilities. VISTA especially needs people in architecture, law, nursing, agriculture and business. The Peace Corps needs persons in agriculture, math-science education, French, business and the skilled trades.

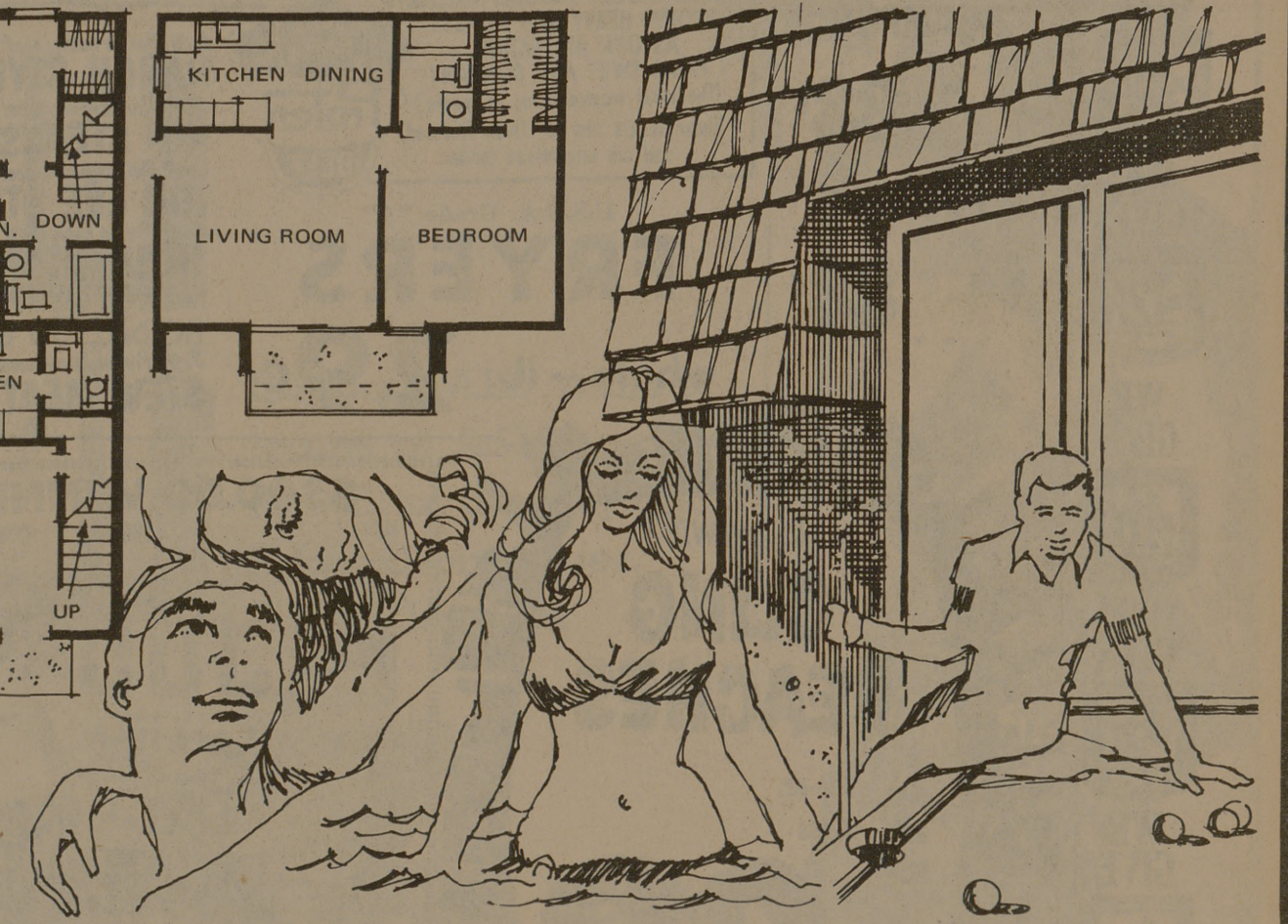
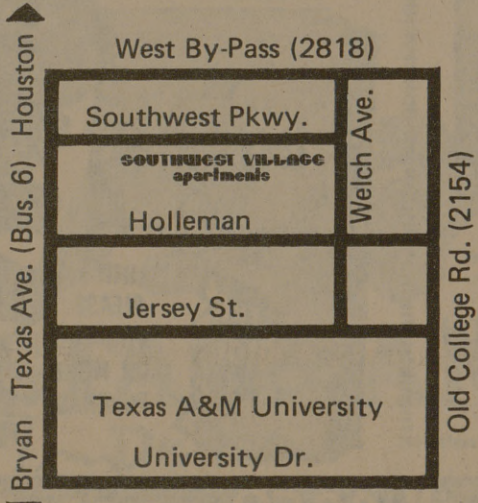
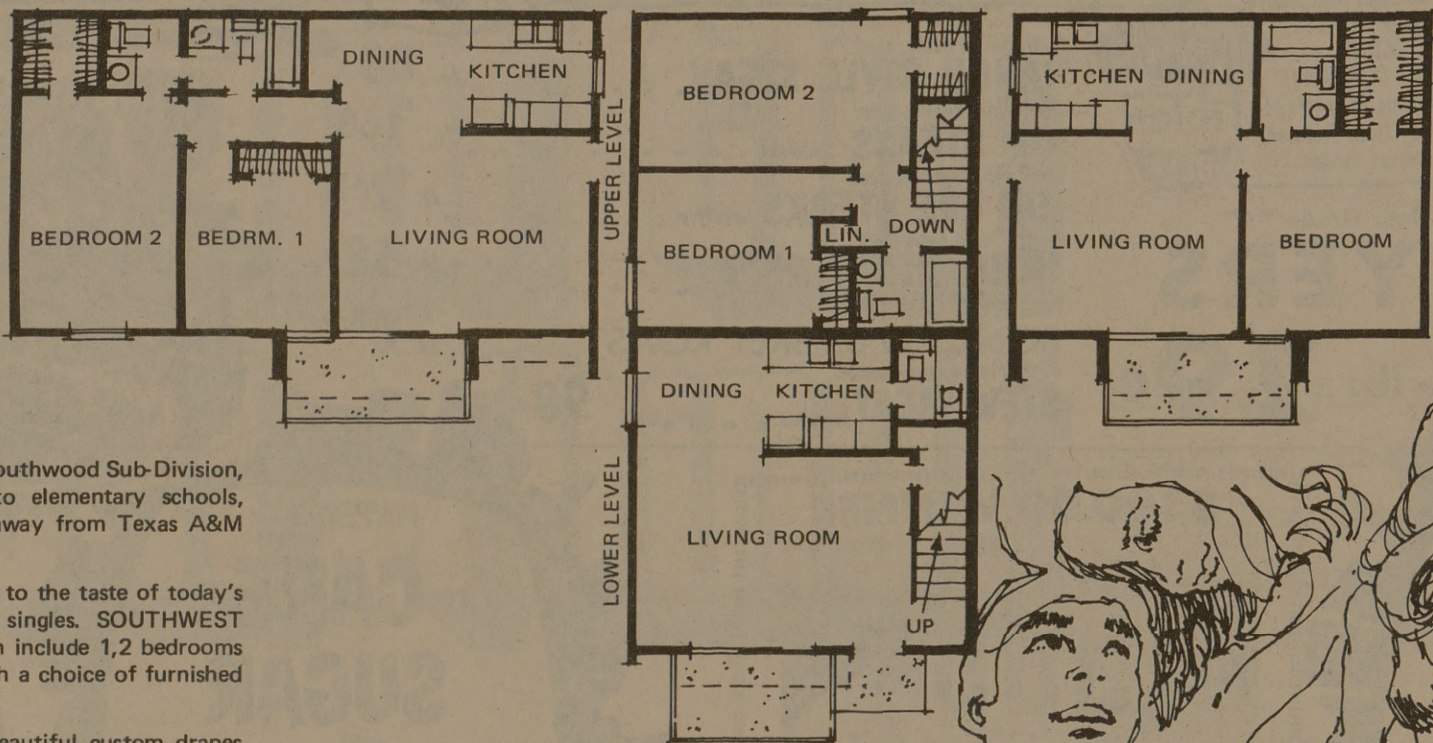
