

A&M still leads Air Force ROTC

A&M not only retained the national lead in Air Force ROTC officer production during fiscal 1972, but increased its margin, announced Col. Robert F. Crossland.

TAMU commissioned 135 officers, an increase of 19 per cent over fiscal year 1971.

The Citadel ranked second in Air Force commissions, with 88. Other military colleges, with full time, uniformed cadet corps, were VMI with 60, VPI 44 and Norwich University four, revealed

Col. Crossland, professor of aerospace studies.

Among other AFROTC detachments in Texas, UT-Austin commissioned 49, Tech 33, SMU, North Texas and Southwest Texas as 22 each, Baylor and TCU 18 each and East Texas 17.

Crossland said the full national report offers several interesting comparisons among total male enrollment, AFROTC enrollment and officer production.

A&M ranks 24th on the list in male enrollment, second in num-

ber of cadets in the Air Force program and first in officer production.

Only Ohio State is among the top 10 in all three categories. First in total male enrollment, the Buckeyes rank fifth in AFROTC participation and fifth in number of officers, with 67.

"The only school with a larger AFROTC enrollment than Texas A&M is Memphis State, which has compulsory ROTC for freshmen," Crossland reported. MSU's 1,599 in AFROTC include 1,422 fresh-

men. In 1972, 61 officers were commissioned.

TAMU's AFROTC enrollment for the year past was 1,081; The Citadel, 584; Clemson, 411; Ohio State, 406, and Brigham Young, 403.

Trailing A&M and The Citadel in officer production are Auburn, 80; Brigham Young, 72; Ohio State, 67; Oklahoma State, 65; Alabama, 63; Kansas State and Memphis State, 61 each, and VMI, 60.

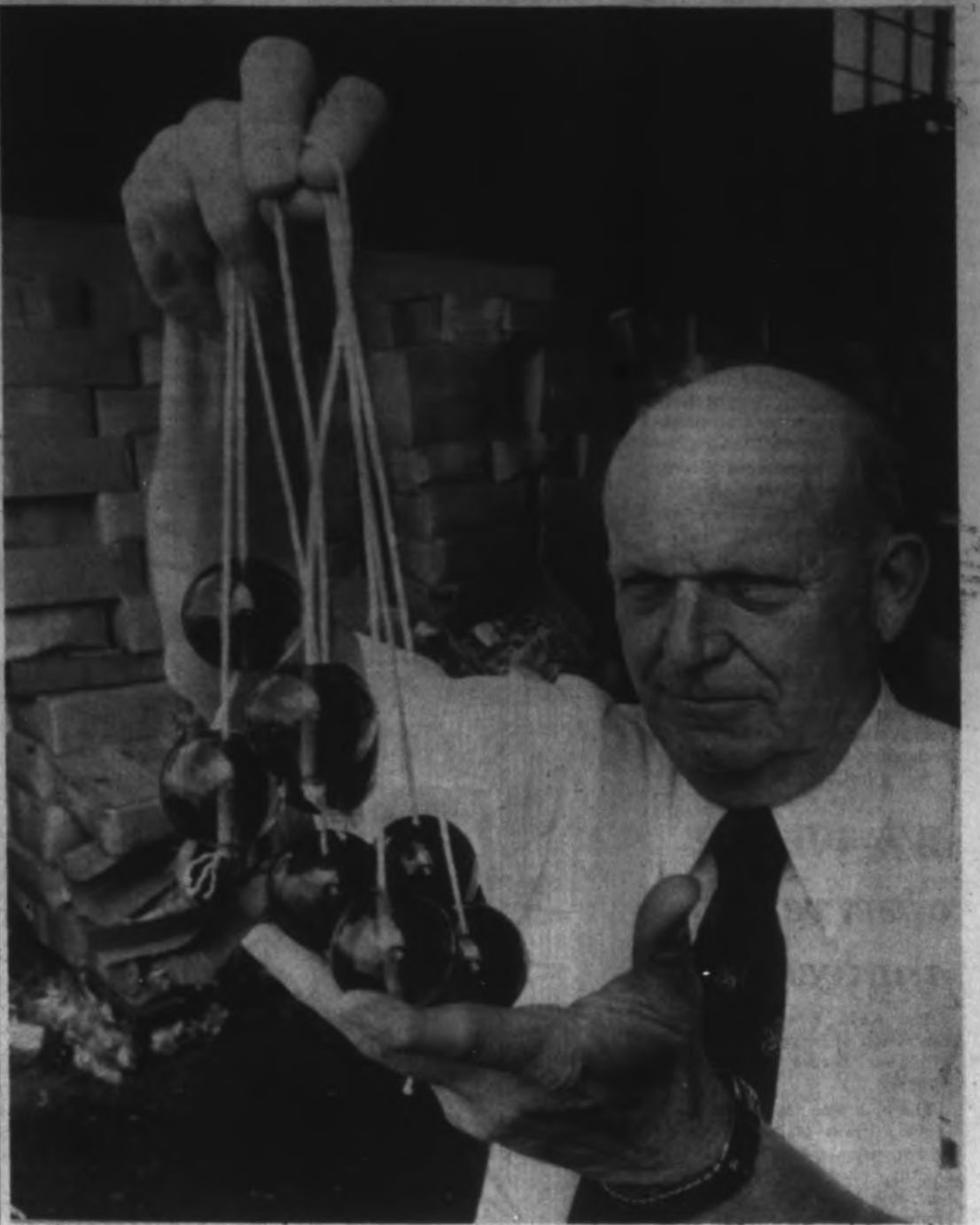

Gonzalez wins Ford fellowship

Stephen M. Gonzalez of San Antonio has been selected for a Ford Foundation doctoral fellowship supporting graduate studies at A&M.

A senior in biochemistry, Gonzalez expects to complete the bachelor degree this summer.

The Ford Foundation fellowship is one of 160 granted to 69 blacks, 43 Mexican Americans, 29 Puerto Ricans and 16 American Indians. The awards average \$5,000 a year for up to five years.

Doctoral fellowships are granted to minority students just beginning graduate study. They are designed to increase the supply of minority college and university faculty members. Fellowships cover full tuition and fees, books, supplies and a monthly allowance.

The Ford Foundation also announced 309 recipients of advanced study awards and 93 dissertation fellowships in ethnic studies. A total of \$6.5 million was allocated to 1972 programs.

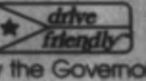
