At summer camp

Air Force ROTC cadets win 10 awards

Air Force ROTC cadets from A&M collected 10 individual awards at summer field training, including the outstanding cadet at Eglin AFB, Fla., Robert L. Jones of Las Cruces, N. M.

Jones won the AFROTC Commandant's Award in competition with nearly 400 cadets from the nation's five military schools.

His No. 1 camp ranking gives A&M a near clean sweep of top cadet awards at the various summer training sessions.

TAMU had the top Army ROTC cadet at Fort Riley, Kan., in Leslie C. Lyons of Honolulu. Edward P. Rumold of Phillipsburg,

N. J., scored highest in Ranger training at Fort Benning, Ga. Another Ranger class to graduate Aug. 31 so far has Aggies in the No. 1 and 2 positions.

Col. Robert F. Crossland, professor of aerospace studies and TAMU's ranking Air Force officer, said six AFROTC cadets are still participating in field training and may increase the award total.

Jones, Gary L. Buis of Sugar

Land and Calvin L. Ramage of Hooks won camp-wide awards at Eglin. Buis was the Air Force Times honoree, for contributing to field training esprit through attitude, eagerness, officer and leadership potential and participation in various activities.

Ramage was a two-award winner. He was one of six TAMU cadets ranked at the top of their flights and also received the camp-wide athletic award.

Howard S. Colter of Odessa; Michael E. Dickey, Alvin; William M. Fraser, Texas City; Martin F. Littleken Jr., Wichita Falls; John M. Turner, Dallas, and Ramage earned AFROTC Vice-Commandant Awards for winning individual competition within their flights.

David D. Hardin of San Antonio won an academic achievement award, a flight-level honor. A&M, The Citadel, Norwich,

VMI and VPI sent cadets to Eglin for the special enriched camp for cadets from military schools. TAMU had 141 cadets in field training, 124 at Eglin.

"A&M cadets won half of the AFROTC awards available at Eglin though they represented only a third of the cadets attending," Col. Crossland noted.

Monday deadline to get tickets for Heaton dinner

Monday is the deadline for purchasing tickets to the Aug. 31 appreciation dinner for Dean H. Lloyd Heaton, announced Dr. Haskell M. Monroe, A&M assistant vice president for academic affairs.

Monroe, who heads the committee organizing the dinner, noted the date coincides with the

day Dean Heaton closes out a 38-year career at TAMU.

Tickets to the 7 p.m. dinner in the Ramada Inn ballroom are available through the Association of Former Students office in the Memorial Student Center and at all local banks.

"The informal dinner will simply give everyone in the Bryan-College Station community an opportunity to join in expressing appreciation to this man who has provided long and dedicated service to the university," Dr. Monroe pointed out.

TAMU President Jack K. Williams and Dr. John C. Calhoun Jr., vice president for academic affairs, will be among the speak-

ers honoring the university's first dean of admissions and records.

Heaton was appointed to the newly created position in 1969. He was named registrar in 1941, with his title changed to director of admissions and registrar in 1956. He joined the institution as assistant registrar in 1934.

The dean has signed more than 50,000 diplomas—nearly 90 percent of the total conferred during TAMU's 96-year history.

Special Spanish course offered

A special course in Spanish for Mexican-Americans will be taught this fall by the Modern Languages Department at A&M.

Students raised in the Southwest speaking Spanish and part-time students who wish to improve their knowledge of their mother tongue may enroll, according to Dr. Jack A. Dabbs, department head.
