Football scrimmage set for tonight

Early fall drills for the A&M football squad have found the Aggies in good shape after the summer vacation, and the enthusiasm shown by the team has won the praise of the coaches.

A full-pad scrimmage is scheduled for 7 tonight. Workouts are being held at Kyle Field at 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. daily. Practice is open to the public, but attendance has been relatively poor during the first week.

Two freshmen have worked their way to the first team, with two others on the second unit and another on the third.

Ernest (Bubba) Bean of Kirbyville was moved to the number one halfback slot when John Bounds left the team because of personal problems. Richard Osborne, the 6-4, 215 pounder from

San Antonio Lee, is working at split end for the first team.

On the second unit are Skip Walker of Del Valle at the halfback spot behind junior Mark Green. Carl (Speedy) Roaches is behind Osborne at split end. Roaches is a graduate of Houston Smiley. Fullback Alvin Bowers of Wharton is the only freshman on the third squad.

Bean is 6-0 and 190, Walker is 5-10 and 170, Roaches is 5-9 and 180, and Bowers is 5-11 and 205. The rest of the freshmen are working out separately from the varsity.

The first team lines up with Osborne at split end; Mike Park

(6-4 and 232) at left tackle; Todd Christopher (6-2 and 237) at left guard; Skip Kuehn (6-0 and 225) at center; Buster Callaway (6-3 and 258) at right guard; Ralph Sacra (6-5 and 235) at right tackle; Homer May (6-3 and 237) at tight end; Lex James (6-0 and 192) at quarterback; Bean and Green at the halfbacks; and Brad Dusek (6-2 and 212) at fullback.

Defensively, Max Bird (6-0 and 223) and James Dubcak (6-6 and 240) are the ends, and Boice Best (6-1 and 233) and Bill Wiebold (6-3 and 224) are the tackles. The linebackers are Grady Hoermann (6-0 and 217)

in the middle, with Dennis Caruth (5-11 and 209) and Kent Finley (6-0 and 209) on either side. The secondary has Corky Sheffield (5-10 and 180) and Robert Murski (6-0 and 189) at the corners and Dwight LaBauve (6-1 and 188) and Larry Ellis (5-11 and 172) at the safeties.

Roberto Payan is still ahead of Pat McDermott for the placekicking job, and Murski is leading Bill Nutt and Steve Canter for the punting chores.

Two-a-day workouts conclude this weekend, since classes begin Monday. Offensively, the first team wears white jerseys during practice, with the second team in green and the third unit in blue. Defensively, maroon denotes first teams, with the second unit in gold and the third in red.

Associate band director becomes Texas Guard major

Joe T. Haney, associate director of the Texas Aggie Band, was sworn in Tuesday as an officer in the Texas State Guard.

Members of the guard including the deputy commanding general, Brig. Gen. Jack Brown of Austin, were present for the ceremony at A&M.

Lt. Col. E. V. Adams, Aggie Band director, administered the oath.

Maj. Haney was appointed associate director in June and works with Col. Adams on the myriad details that go into the famous TAMU musical organization's performances.

They will first appear together with the Aggie Band in public Sept. 23 at the A&M-LSU football game in Baton Rouge.

Sociology prof attends institute

Dr. Robert L. Skrabanek of A&M attended a six-week National Science Foundation summer institute on social demography and population policy this summer at Cornell University.

Skrabanek is professor in the Sociology and Anthropology Department and the Texas Real Estate Research Center. His teaching and research centers on demography and population analysis.

Maj. Haney, who served three years with a military band, will remain in College Station, though assigned to the State Guard's general headquarters staff in Austin.

General Brown explained that Haney will be attached to the 203rd Military Police Battalion, a Bryan guard unit commanded by Col. Ira E. Scott. As liaison officer with the 203rd, Maj. Haney will be in position to fulfill TAMU staff duties with the Aggie Band.

The Tuesday ceremony at the Aggie Band hall was also attended by Mrs. Haney, Mrs. Adams, Capt. Arlie D. Patton and Capt. Frank Kocman of the 203rd, headquartered at the Army Reserve Armory in Bryan.

A veteran of 22 years directing state high school bands, Haney is the Aggie Band's first associate director. He joined Col. Adams last June after 16 years at Mexia.

Both Adams and Haney marched and played at A&M under the late Col. Richard J. Dunn, Aggie bandmaster from 1924 to 1946. Adams, dean of Southwest Conference band directors, is in his 27th year at the helm of the Aggie Band.

Col. Adams is an Army Reserve officer, regularly seen in uniform with the TAMU band.

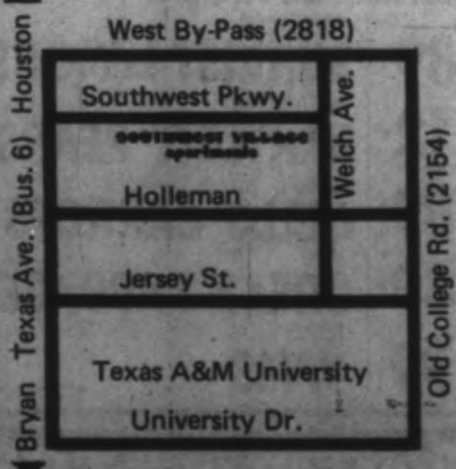
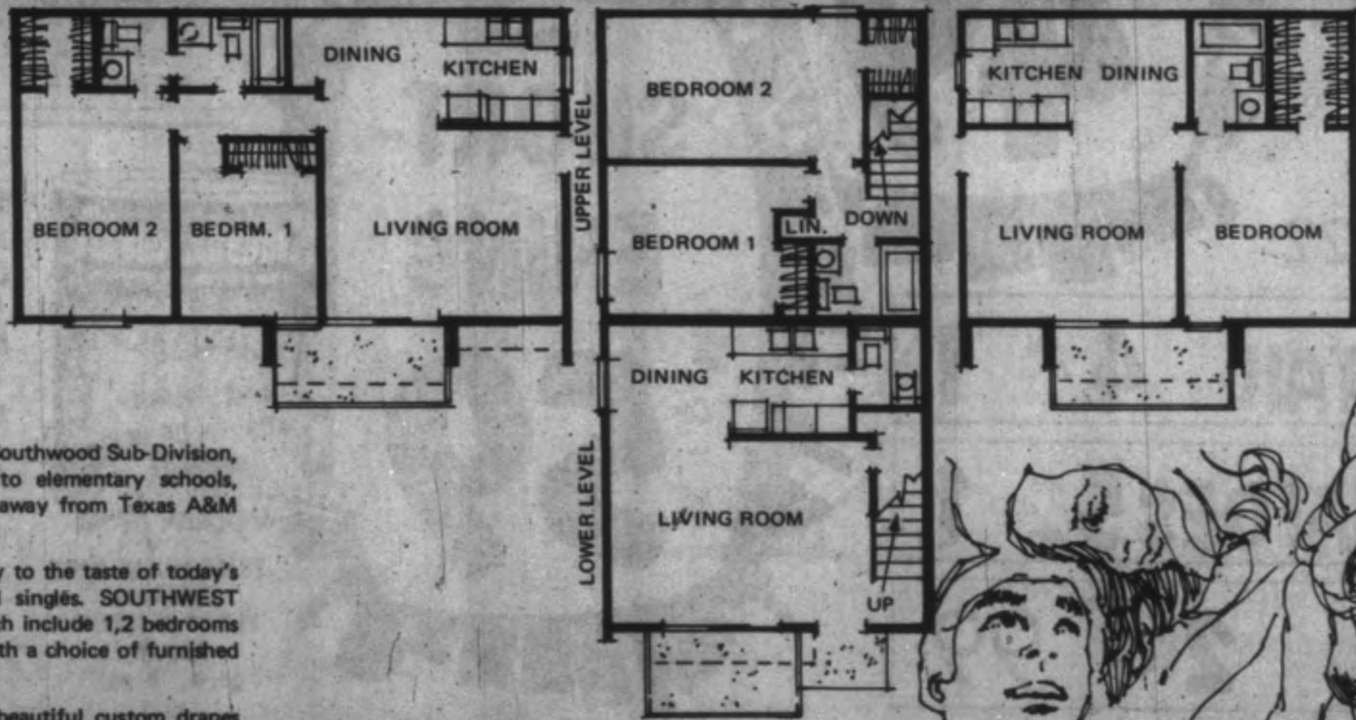
